A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RESIDENT TUITION FEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that facilitating 2 postsecondary education and training for all interested high 3 school graduates is a matter of statewide concern. Postsecondary options assist graduates by preparing them for 4 5 jobs and career pathways that typically pay higher wages, which 6 enables them to achieve their educational and career goals and 7 afford the State's high cost of living. Increased enrollment 8 and completion of postsecondary education and training will 9 increase the State's human capital.

10 The legislature further finds that the university of Hawaii 11 amended its administrative rules to streamline the enrollment 12 process for all applicants for admission into the university of 13 Hawaii system; however, the current statutory requirements 14 regarding residency for tuition purposes pose challenges for 15 some local graduating high school seniors or recent graduates. 16 Specifically, some students experiencing homelessness have 17 difficulty providing evidence of bona fide residency as required

1 by statute, and students who have complex family situations may 2 be incorrectly considered nonresidents. The legislature further 3 finds that recognizing local high school graduates as residents 4 to qualify for resident tuition fees would facilitate the 5 enrollment of these students at one of the university of 6 Hawaii's campuses.

7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to simplify the 8 residency determination for the State's high school graduates to 9 enroll in postsecondary education and training at the university 10 of Hawaii by considering graduates of the State's high schools 11 to be residents for tuition purposes.

12 SECTION 2. Section 304A-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows:

"[+]§304A-402[+] Residence for tuition purposes; basic 14 rule. The board of regents shall adopt the necessary rules 15 16 defining residence for tuition purposes herein; provided that the basic rule shall be that a student shall qualify for the 17 resident tuition fee only if the following criteria are met: 18 (1) The adult student, or in the case of a minor student, 19 20 the student's parents or guardians, has or have been a bona fide resident of this State for at least twelve 21

1 consecutive months next preceding the student's first 2 day of officially scheduled instruction for any 3 semester or term in which the student is enrolling at 4 the particular college or campus; and The adult or minor student has not been claimed as a 5 (2) dependent for tax purposes for at least twelve months 6 next preceding the student's first day of officially 7 scheduled instruction for any semester or term in 8 9 which the student is enrolling at the particular college or campus by the student's parents or 10 guardians who are nonresidents of the State; provided 11 12 that this provision shall not apply in cases where the parent claiming the student as a dependent is entitled 13 to do so under a child support order or agreement 14 issued or entered into in conjunction with a divorce 15 16 proceeding or legal separation agreement and the other parent and the student meet the criteria set forth in 17 18 paragraph (1)[-]; or 19 (3) The adult or minor student: 20 (A) Graduated from a high school in the State within 21 four years preceding the student's first day of
