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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. (a) There is established a homelessness  
2 sanctuary pilot program to provide a safe location on public  
3 lands for homeless individuals and families. The program shall  
4 be administered by the governor's coordinator on homelessness in  
5 coordination with the department of human services and the city  
6 and county of Honolulu.

7           (b) No later than November 1, 2025, the governor's  
8 coordinator on homelessness shall designate a specific location  
9 on state or county land for the homelessness sanctuary pilot  
10 program. The state or county agency having jurisdiction over  
11 the land shall work with the governor's coordinator on  
12 homelessness to:

13           (1) Ensure that the location has sufficient infrastructure  
14           to support the pilot program; and

15           (2) Minimize adverse impacts to the environment, including  
16           to nearshore resources such as corals, reef fish, and  
17           seabirds.



1 (c) The location designated by the State and city and  
2 county of Honolulu pursuant to subsection (b) shall serve as a  
3 safe location for homeless individuals and families to reside  
4 and access services. The governor's coordinator on  
5 homelessness, department of human services, and city and county  
6 of Honolulu shall:

7 (1) Open the location for habitation and provision of  
8 services no later than January 1, 2026;

9 (2) Coordinate to provide the following facilities at the  
10 designated location:

11 (A) A central tent for shelter;

12 (B) A parking area at which residents may:

13 (i) Park their vehicles; and

14 (ii) Sleep in their vehicles, if the residents  
15 choose to do so;

16 (C) Restroom and shower facilities;

17 (D) Lockers and storage space;

18 (E) Laundry facilities; and

19 (F) Solid waste collection and disposal;

20 (3) Allow for residents to set up additional, individual  
21 tents as needed by the residents;



1 (4) Partner with nonprofit organizations and other  
2 entities to provide at least one meal per day to each  
3 resident;

4 (5) Allow residents to be accompanied by pet animals;

5 (6) Establish volunteer and employment opportunities for  
6 residents; provided that:

7 (A) Residents employed under this paragraph shall be  
8 paid not less than the minimum wage; and

9 (B) Volunteer and employment opportunities, to the  
10 extent possible, shall focus on clean-up  
11 activities, vegetation control, painting, and  
12 other tasks for which the state and county  
13 governments are experiencing a backlog; and

14 (7) To the extent possible, establish a zero-tolerance  
15 policy for illegal drugs, violence, and obscenities.

16 (d) The governor's coordinator on homelessness shall  
17 survey residents to determine other facilities and services that  
18 residents need or desire, including:

19 (1) Workshop areas for job training;

20 (2) Education opportunities;

21 (3) Gardening;



1 (4) Childcare to allow residents with children to seek and  
2 maintain employment;

3 (5) Transportation for children to attend school; and

4 (6) Transportation for residents to access bus and rail  
5 services that allow residents to more easily access  
6 their places of employment.

7 Subject to available funds, the governor's coordinator on  
8 homelessness and the coordinator's partner agencies may offer  
9 facilities and services identified by residents as high priority  
10 needs or desires under this subsection.

11 (e) The state homelessness coordinator may contract with  
12 qualified churches, nonprofit organizations, businesses, and  
13 other entities pursuant to chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised  
14 Statutes, for the purposes of this Act.

15 (f) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
16 the regular sessions of 2026, 2027, and 2028, the governor's  
17 coordinator on homelessness shall submit a report to the  
18 legislature that includes:

19 (1) Progress the State and city and county of Honolulu  
20 have made in establishing the homelessness sanctuary  
21 pilot program;



- 1           (2) The number of homeless individuals and families served  
2           by the program;
- 3           (3) An evaluation of the homelessness sanctuary pilot  
4           program to determine whether the objectives of the  
5           program have been met or exceeded;
- 6           (4) An assessment of the impact of the homelessness  
7           sanctuary pilot program on the homelessness problem in  
8           Hawaii;
- 9           (5) An accounting of the expenditure of moneys  
10          appropriated by this Act, including a summary of any  
11          contracts entered into pursuant to subsection (e);
- 12          (6) A recommendation of whether the homelessness sanctuary  
13          pilot program should be made permanent; and
- 14          (7) Any other findings and recommendations, including any  
15          proposed legislation.
- 16          (g) The homelessness sanctuary pilot program shall cease  
17 to exist on December 31, 2027.
- 18          (h) As used in this section:
- 19          "County" means the city and county of Honolulu.



1 "Designated location" means the location on state or county  
2 land designated for the homelessness sanctuary pilot program  
3 pursuant to subsection (b).

4 "Homeless" has the same meaning as in section 346-361,  
5 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

6 "Pet animal" has the same meaning as in section 711-1100,  
7 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

8 "Resident" means a homeless person who lives at or receives  
9 services from the homelessness sanctuary pilot program.

10 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much  
12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 for the  
13 homelessness sanctuary pilot program.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
15 human services for the purposes of this Act; provided that the  
16 appropriation made by this section shall not lapse at the end of  
17 the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made; provided  
18 further that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as  
19 of June 30, 2027, shall lapse as of that date.

20 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,  
21 the governor may transfer all or a portion of the appropriation



1 in this section to other state or county agencies for  
2 expenditures incurred to implement the homelessness sanctuary  
3 pilot program.

4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

**Report Title:**

Homelessness; Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness; DHS; City and County of Honolulu; Appropriation

**Description:**

Establishes a 2-year homelessness sanctuary pilot program, to be administered by the Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness in coordination with the Department of Human Services and the City and County of Honolulu. Directs the Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness to designate a specific location on state or county land for the pilot program, which shall serve as a safe location for homeless individuals and families to reside and access services. Requires the Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness and the coordinator's partner agencies to provide certain facilities and services at the designated location. Requires reports to the Legislature. Sunsets 12/31/2027. Appropriates moneys.
