A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 207, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 2022, codified as section 188-23.5, Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes, prohibits the possession or use on, in, or
- 4 near state marine waters, of any unmanned aerial vehicles,
- 5 otherwise known as drones, for the purpose of taking aquatic
- 6 life. The legislature further finds that drone-assisted
- 7 fishing, when used responsibly, can have certain benefits.
- 8 Thus, the legislature believes drone-assisted fishing should be
- 9 regulated rather than prohibited.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to repeal
- 11 section 188-23.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and establish a
- 12 framework for regulation and enforcement of responsible drone
- 13 fishing practices.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

8	(1)	Application procedures and requirements;							
9	(2)	Criteria for permit approval or denial;							
10	(3)	Conditions and restrictions on permit grantees;							
11	(4)	Permit fees; and							
12	(5)	Penalties for non-compliance.							
13	Permits sl	hall be valid for one year from the date of issuance							
14	and may be	e renewed annually.							
15	(b)	The department of land and natural resources shall							
16	enforce th	his section and adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91. In							
17	cases of m	noncompliance, the department may:							
18	(1)	Issue citations and fines, as determined by the							
19		department, to individuals using unmanned aerial							
20		vehicles for the purpose of taking aquatic life							
21		without a valid permit; and							

1	(2)	Seize for forfeiture any unmanned aerial vehicle used
2		in violation of this section, pursuant to
3		chapter 712A.
4	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall charge applicants, at minimum, a:
5	(1)	\$100 annual fee per permit;
6	(2)	\$25 processing fee for first-time applicants; and
7	(3)	\$10 reissuance fee for lost or damaged permits.
8	<u>(d)</u>	The department shall maintain records of all permits
9	issued, v	iolations reported, and enforcement actions conducted
10	pursuant t	to this Act. The department shall submit an annual
11	report to	the legislature no later than twenty days before the
12	convening	of each regular session summarizing its record of
13	activities	s during the reporting year.
14	<u>(e)</u>	As used in this section, "unmanned aerial vehicle"
15	means any	aerial vehicle that is operated without the
16	possibilit	ty of direct human intervention within or on the aerial
17	vehicle."	
18	SECT	ION 3. Section 188-23.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	repealed.	
20	[" [\$]	188-23.5] Possession or use of unmanned aerial

vehicles on, in, or near state marine waters prohibited;



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1	exception. (a) It is unlawful to possess or use on, in, or									
2	near state marine waters, any unmanned aerial vehicles, for the									
3	purpose of taking aquatic life, except under the terms and									
4	conditions of a permit first obtained by the user from the									
5	department of land and natural resources; provided that unmanned									
6	aerial vehicles may be used for the purpose of simple									
7	reconnaissance. The department of land and natural resources									
8	may issue permits for the possession or use of unmanned aerial									
9	vehicles consistent with other legal requirements.									
10	(b) As used in this section, "unmanned aerial vehicle"									
11	means any aerial vehicle that is operated without the									
12	possibility of direct human intervention within or on the aerial									
13	vehicle."]									
14	SECTION 4. The department of land and natural resources									
15	shall establish the permitting system pursuant to section 2 of									
16	this Act according to the following timeline:									
17	(1) No later than February 28, 2026, the department shall:									
18	(A) Initiate the convening of a task force to design									
19	the permitting system; and									
20	(B) Begin consultations with stakeholders, including									
21	the fishing community and businesses,									



1		environmental experts, and legal advisors, to
2		establish guidelines for permits;
3	(2)	No later than March 31, 2026, the department shall:
4		(A) Draft rules for the permitting system; and
5		(B) Conduct initial public hearings to collect public
6		input and feedback on the draft rules;
7	(3)	No later than April 30, 2026, the department shall:
8		(A) Propose finalized rules pursuant to chapter 91;
9		(B) Begin development of the technical framework for
10		issuing permits, including online and in-person
11		systems; and
12		(C) Allocate necessary funding for system
13		implementation;
14	(4)	No later than June 30, 2026, the department shall:
15		(A) Initiate a public education campaign to inform
16		the fishing community and general public about
17		the new permitting requirements, including
18		penalties for non-compliance; and
19		(B) Begin recruitment and training of personnel to
20		manage the permitting system and staff
21		enforcement operations;
