A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE SUN SCREENING DEVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 291-21.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 3 "(d) This section shall not apply to: 4 Rearview mirrors; (1)5 Adjustable nontransparent sun visors [which] that are (2) mounted forward of the side windows and are not 6 7 attached to the glazing material; 8 (3) Signs, stickers, or other materials [which] that are 9 displayed in a seven-inch square in the lower corner 10 of the windshield farthest removed from the driver or 11 signs, stickers, or other materials [which] that are 12 displayed in a five-inch square in the lower corner of the windshield nearest the driver; 13 14 (4)Rear trunk lid handle or hinges; 15 (5) Window wipers and window wiper motors; 16 (6) Transparent sun screening film materials [which] that are installed, affixed, or applied along the top edge 17

1		of the windshield so long as [such] the materials do
2		not encroach upon the AS-1 portion of the windshield
3		as provided by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard
4		205 or no lower than four inches below the top of the
5		windshield, when measured from the middle point of the

7		if no AS-1 markings can be found in the left or right
8		upper margin of the windshield;
9	(7)	Sun screening devices for front side wing vents and
10		windows [which, that, when used in conjunction with
11		the glazing material have a light transmittance of no
12		less than [thirty-five] twenty-five per cent plus or
13		minus six per cent;

(8) Sun screening devices for side windows necessary for driving visibility [which] that are to the rear of the driver and for rear windows necessary for driving visibility [which,] that, when used in conjunction with the glazing material, have a light transmittance of no less than [thirty-five] twenty-five per cent plus or minus six per cent;

1	(9)	Side windows [which] that are to the rear of the
2		driver and rear windows on vans, minivans, trucks, or
3		buses; provided that the vehicles are equipped with
4		rearview mirrors on both sides;
5	(10)	Privacy drapes, curtains, or blinds, or any
6		combination, installed on the interior of motor homes;
7		[or]
8	(11)	Transparent sun screening materials, when applied to
9		the AS-1 portion of the windshield, which meets the
10		requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard
11		205[-]; or
12	(12)	For motor vehicles owned by persons having light
13		sensitivity of the eyes or skin due to a medical
14		condition, as evidenced by documentation that shall be
15		updated every two years from a physician licensed
16		under chapter 453, and that cannot be resolved with
17		eye protection devices, any sun screening devices
18		that, when used in conjunction with the glazing
19		material, have a light transmittance of no less than
20		twenty per cent; provided that all side wing vents and
21		side rear windows to which a tint has been applied in

1	excess of the level permitted under paragraphs (7) and
2	(8) shall be rolled down when the motor vehicle is
3	stopped by a law enforcement officer at a traffic
4	stop."
5	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Motor Vehicles; Safety; Equipment; Sun Screening Devices; Window Tinting; Exemptions
