## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COLORECTAL CANCER.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is								
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part II to be appropriately								
3	designate	d and to read as follows:								
4	" <u>\$34</u>	<u>\$346-</u> State-funded assistance for colorectal cancer								
5	screening	<b>s.</b> (a) The department shall provide financial								
6	assistance, as appropriated by the legislature, to pay for									
7	<u>colorecta</u>	colorectal cancer screenings for residents of the State who:								
8	(1)	Are uninsured;								
9	(2)	Have healthcare coverage that does not provide								
10		coverage without cost sharing for colorectal cancer								
11		screenings that meet the requirements of sections								
12		431:10A-122 and 432:1-617;								
13	(3)	Are permanent United States resident aliens but are								
14		ineligible for medicare; or								
15	(4)	Are nonresident aliens and are ineligible for								
16		medicare.								



(b) 1 The state-funded screenings shall meet the requirements of sections 431:10A-122 and 432:1-617." 2 SECTION 2. Section 431:10A-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 3 4 is amended to read as follows: 5 "[<del>[</del>]§431:10A-122[<del>] Colon</del>] Colorectal cancer screening 6 coverage. (a) Each policy of accident and health or sickness 7 insurance providing coverage for health care, except for 8 policies that only provide coverage for specified diseases or 9 other limited benefit coverage, shall provide coverage for 10 [colorectal cancer] colorectal cancer screening by all A and B 11 grade screening modalities as recommended by the United States 12 Preventive Services Task Force. 13 (b) For purposes of this section, all coverage for 14 colorectal cancer screenings shall be consistent with the 15 Affordable Care Act implementation frequently asked questions 16 published by the United States Department of Labor, United 17 States Department of Health and Human Services, and United 18 States Department of the Treasury. 19 [(b)] (c) Beginning March 1, 2011, all health insurance 20 providers in Hawaii shall inform their insured about the risk 21 associated with undiagnosed [colorectal cancer] colorectal

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<u>cancer</u> and encourage the insured to consult with the insured's
 physician about available screening options."

3 SECTION 3. Section 432:1-617, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

[[]§432:1-617[] Colon] Colorectal cancer screening
coverage. (a) All individual and group hospital and medical
service contracts providing health care coverage shall provide
coverage for [colorectal-cancer] colorectal cancer screening by
all A and B grade screening modalities as recommended by the
United States Preventive Services Task Force.

(b) For purposes of this section, all coverage for
colorectal cancer screenings shall be consistent with the
Affordable Care Act implementation frequently asked questions
published by the United States Department of Labor, United
States Department of Health and Human Services, and United
States Department of the Treasury.

17 [-(b)-] (c) Beginning March 1, 2011, all health insurance 18 providers in Hawaii shall inform their insured of the risk 19 associated with undiagnosed colorectal cancer and encourage the 20 insured to consult with the insured's physician about available 21 screening options."



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1	SECTION 4. (a) The department of human services shall											
2	adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to implement section 1 of											
3	this Act, including rules establishing an application process											
4	for state-funded colorectal cancer screenings.											
5	(b) In adopting rules pursuant to this Act, the department											
6	shall ensure that:											
7	(1) The state-funded colorectal cancer screenings meet the											
8	requirements of sections 431:10A-122 and 432:1-617;											
9	and											
10	(2) No cost-sharing requirements are imposed.											
11	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general											
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much											
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the											
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year											
15	2026-2027 for the department of human services to develop and											
16	implement a public assistance program offering state-funded											
17	colorectal cancer screenings.											
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department											
19	of human services for the purposes of this Act.											
20	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed											
21	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

DHS; Colorectal Cancer Screenings; State-Funded; Appropriation

Requires and appropriates moneys for the Department of Human Services to develop and implement a public assistance program offering state-funded colorectal screenings for certain persons. Requires coverage for all colorectal cancer screenings in the State to be consistent with the Affordable Care Act Implementation Frequently Asked Questions published by the United States Department of Labor, United States Department of Health and Human Services, and United States Department of the Treasury.
