A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that approximately ten 2 per cent of the State's teachers switch schools, relocate, or 3 leave the profession each year. Only fifty to sixty per cent of 4 current teachers have been at their school for five years or 5 more. Chronic teacher turnover forces the department of 6 education to rely on emergency hires and substitute teachers to fill vacancies. The legislature further finds that teacher 7 8 recruitment and retention are especially difficult at hard-to-9 staff schools.

10 The legislature additionally finds that Hawaii's high cost 11 of living is a significant contributing factor in the department 12 of education's teacher recruitment and retention efforts. 13 According to a WalletHub study, Hawaii ranked fifty-first out of 14 fifty states and the District of Columbia for starting teacher 15 salary and median teacher salary, adjusted for cost of living. 16 The purpose of this Act is to alleviate the financial 17 burden on teachers and improve teacher recruitment and retention



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1 by establishing a teacher housing assistance program to provide 2 housing vouchers to qualified full-time teachers who are 3 employed by the department of education or a charter school and 4 teach at a hard-to-fill school, as determined by the department, 5 including public charter schools. 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by adding a new section to subpart E, part III to be 8 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 9 "§302A-Teacher housing assistance program. (a) There 10 is established a teacher housing assistance program to be 11 administered by the department to provide housing vouchers to 12 eligible teachers. If the number of applications exceeds the 13 number of available housing vouchers, housing vouchers shall be 14 provided to eligible teachers through a lottery process. 15 (b) A housing voucher provided under this section shall be 16 used for: 17 Rent for the eligible teacher's primary residence; (1) 18 Mortgage payments for the eligible teacher's primary (2) 19 residence; or



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(3) Down payment on residential real property; provided
that the property shall be the eligible teacher's
primary residence.
(c) A housing voucher shall not exceed \$500 per month or
the eligible teacher's monthly rent or mortgage payment,
whichever is less. A housing voucher granted pursuant to this
section shall be applicable for one year. The voucher shall be
renewable for one additional year.
(d) Upon the establishment of the teacher housing
assistance program, the department shall develop an application
procedure and processes, procedures, and forms necessary to
implement and maintain the program. The department shall work
with the state public charter school commission to develop a
process to verify that an eligible teacher satisfies the
criteria listed in subsection (f).
(e) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
to effectuate the purpose of this section.
(f) For the purposes of this section, "eligible teacher"
means a person who:
(1) Is a full-time teacher;



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1	(2)	Has taught at a school in the State for at least one
2		year prior to the application date;
3	(3)	Is employed by the department of education or a public
4	charter s	chool;
5	(4)	Commits to teach at a hard-to-fill school, as
6		determined by the department of education, or a public
7		charter school for no less than five consecutive
8		years;
9	(5)	Resides in the State;
10	(6)	Does not own, operate, rent, or control any
11		residential real property in addition to the eligible
12		teacher's primary residence for which the housing
13		voucher is sought; and
14	(7)	Has a household income below per cent of the area
15		median income."
16	SECT	ION 3. Section 302A-833, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
18	"(b)	The revolving fund may be used by the department of
19	education	for any and all of the purposes of teachers' housing,
20	including	the [planning,];



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1	(1)	Planning, construction, maintenance, and operation of	
2		teachers' housing[, as well as for the salaries] <u>;</u>	
3	(2)	Teacher housing assistance program pursuant to section	
4		<u>302A-</u> ; and	
5	(3)	Salaries of the necessary personnel in charge	
6		thereof."	
7	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the teachers'		
8	housing revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof		
9	as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the same sum		
10	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027		
11	for the provision of housing vouchers through the teacher		
12	housing assistance program established by this Act.		
13	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
14	of education for the purposes of this Act.		
15	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
17	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
