A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is necessary for
 the State to investigate and employ new and innovative ways of
 maintaining and improving state services and infrastructure,
 while ensuring the prudent and cost-effective expenditure of
 public moneys.

6 The legislature further finds that in 2022, the legislature 7 authorized a procurement automation system for the executive 8 branch and state agencies. This procurement automation system 9 increases efficiency, saves personnel time, maintains 10 consistency, mitigates confusion for both the buyer and 11 contractor, and produces accurate purchasing data to leverage 12 economies of scale. The legislature also authorized the state 13 procurement office to implement a transaction fee imposed upon 14 vendors using the procurement automation system beginning in 15 fiscal year 2024-2025. This fee is intended to pay for the 16 management of the procurement automation system, including but 17 not limited to implementation, legacy transition, maintenance,

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system training, and system configuration. This fee is
 estimated to save the state approximately \$1,200,000 in general
 funds each year and will assist with funding the growth and
 enhancement of the procurement automation system.

5 While the legislature authorized the implementation of the 6 procurement automation system and a transaction fee collected 7 from vendors using the system, the legislature stopped short of 8 authorizing a state procurement automation system special fund 9 to hold the transaction fee. Until a special fund is authorized 10 and established, the fees are being held in trust by the vendor 11 who developed the procurement automation system; the state 12 procurement office does not have direct control of the fees. 13 The establishment of a special fund would direct that all fees 14 received by the state procurement office pursuant to section 15 103D-206(7), Hawaii Revised Statutes, be deposited into the 16 state procurement automation system special fund to be 17 administered by the state procurement office for the 18 implementation and configuration of the procurement automation 19 system's Marketplace and eProcurement system, as well as its 20 maintenance, enhancement, and expansion of additional modules to

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remain relevant and current with industry standards for the
 benefit of all stakeholders statewide.

3 The legislature also finds that the school facilities 4 authority was established in 2020 by Act 72, Session Laws of 5 Hawaii 2020, codified at section 302A-1702, Hawaii Revised 6 Statutes, with a mandate that the executive director of the 7 school facilities authority serve as its chief procurement 8 officer. Therefore, it is necessary to designate the executive 9 director of the school facilities authority as its chief 10 procurement officer in the Hawaii Public Procurement Code.

11 The purpose of this Act is to enhance procurement
12 accountability by:

13 Establishing the state procurement automation system (1)14 special fund to receive the transaction fees from the 15 procurement automation system to pay for its 16 administration, management, operation, maintenance, 17 and upgrade of the procurement automation system; and 18 (2) Aligning section 103D-203(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, 19 with section 302A-1702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by 20 adding the executive director of the school facilities

3	SECTION 2. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately		
5	designated and to read as follows:		
6	" <u>\$103D-</u> State procurement automation system special		
7	fund; transaction fee. (a) There is established in the state		
8	treasury the state procurement automation system special fund to		
9	be administered by the state procurement office and into which		
10	shall be deposited:		
11	(1) Vendor-collected transaction fees, pursuant to section		
12	103D-206(7), for administration, management,		
13	operation, maintenance, and upgrade of the procurement		
14	automation system; and		
15	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature to the special		
16	fund.		
17	(b) The state procurement automation special fund shall be		
18	expended by the administrator of the state procurement office		
19	for the purposes of the administration, management, operation,		
20	maintenance, and upgrade of the procurement automation system."

8	SECTIO	N 4. Section 103D-204, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by a	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

11	administrative purposes only, within the department of			
12	accounting and general services, which shall be headed by the			
13	administrator of the state procurement office. The			
14	administrator shall be the chief procurement officer for those			
15	governmental bodies of the executive branch as provided in			
16	section [[1	03D-203(a)(8)].] 103D-203(a)(9). The administrator		
17	shall be a t	full-time public official. The administrator shall		
18	serve a terr	m of four years, and shall be paid a salary not to		
19	exceed eighty-seven per cent of the salary of the director of			
20	human resources development, without diminution during the			

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administrator's term of office unless by general law applying to
 all deputies or assistants to department heads."

3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that the amendments made to section 103D-203(a), Hawaii
Revised Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when section
103D-203(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, is reenacted on June 30,
2028, pursuant to Section 16 of Act 8, Special Session Laws of
Hawaii 2021, as amended by section 3 of Act 111, Session Laws of
Hawaii 2024.
