HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO APPLY FOR AND IMPLEMENT THE ELDERLY SIMPLIFIED APPLICATION PROJECT IN THE STATE WHEN CAPABLE.

WHEREAS, many low-income households struggle to purchase 1 food due to Hawaii's high cost of living and food prices; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program 4 (SNAP), formerly known as the Food Stamp Program, is crucial to 5 providing necessary food assistance to some of Hawaii's most 6 economically disadvantaged residents; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, SNAP supports over one hundred thirty 9 thousand individuals, bringing more than \$630,000,000 into the 10 State's economy each year; and 11 12 WHEREAS, these benefits help economically vulnerable 13 households meet their basic nutritional needs without 14 sacrificing their financial security; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the Elderly Simplified Application Project (ESAP) 17 is a demonstration project designed to boost SNAP enrollment 18 among low-income older adults ages sixty years or older by 19 tackling barriers to participation in SNAP; and 20 21 WHEREAS, ESAP enhances program efficiency, simplifies 22 benefit delivery by streamlining the application and 23 certification processes, waives the recertification interview 24 requirement, allows for greater flexibility in verification, and 25 extends the certification period to thirty-six months; and 26 27 WHEREAS, ESAP largely applies to households made up 28 entirely of older adults with no earned income, although certain 29 projects also include adults with disabilities who have no 30



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earned income or allow children to be present in the household, 1 2 under certain conditions; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii does not participate in ESAP; and 5 WHEREAS, if Hawaii were to participate in ESAP, older 6 7 adults in the State would face fewer barriers to accessing SNAP 8 benefits, which could lead to increased enrollment among low-income seniors and an improvement to overall food security 9 10 and health outcomes; now, therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 13 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human 14 Services is requested to apply for and implement the Elderly 15 16 Simplified Application Project in the State when capable; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services is requested to seek any necessary federal approvals or 19 20 waivers to implement the Elderly Simplified Application Project in the State, including amending its rules, policies, and 21 22 procedures; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 26 Services.
