13	(3)	The concentration levels of neonicotinoids and any
14		derivative chemicals in Hawaii beehives and apiaries,
15		and food products harvested from the beehives and

3	(c) The department of agriculture shall submit a report of		
4	its findings and recommendations, including science-based		
5	recommendations on how neonicotinoids should be used and		
6	regulated in the State, and any proposed legislation, to the		
7	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
8	the regular session of 2026.		
9	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 to		
12	conduct the study required by section 1 of this Act.
