### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TREES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§27- Fruit trees; preference in state landscaping.
- 5 (a) When the State creates plans, designs, or specifications
- 6 for new or renovated landscaping that integrates the planting of
- 7 trees as part of any building, complex of buildings, facility,
- 8 complex of facilities, housing, public highway, or other
- 9 landscaping that includes trees, the State, to the extent
- 10 practicable, shall plant trees that bear edible fruit.
- 11 (b) Any person may harvest fruit from a fruit tree planted
- 12 pursuant to this section and the State shall not require any
- 13 permit or license to harvest fruit from trees planted pursuant
- 14 to this section; provided that this subsection shall not be
- 15 construed to bar the State from prohibiting any person from
- 16 trespassing on state lands or otherwise exercising its authority
- 17 as a property owner pursuant to any other law or rule.

## S.B. NO. 2

### Report Title:

Landscaping; Fruit Trees; Harvest; Indemnification

#### Description:

Requires the State, to the extent practicable, to plant fruit trees in new or renovated landscaping that includes trees. Authorizes persons to harvest fruit from those fruit trees. Provides that the State is not liable for any injuries or illnesses resulting from the harvesting or ingesting of fruit, including food-borne illness.
