A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERAL PIGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's
- 2 residents, especially those living in rural areas, should be
- 3 allowed to protect their persons and property from dangerous
- 4 wildlife. Feral pigs can be destructive and pose a threat to
- 5 human safety, agricultural crops, indigenous plants, and other
- 6 animals.
- 7 The legislature recognizes that it can be cumbersome and
- 8 time-consuming to obtain a permit to eradicate feral pigs on
- 9 privately owned land.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to create an
- 11 expedited permitting process to authorize the destruction or
- 12 control of feral pigs on privately owned land, under certain
- 13 circumstances.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 183D-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$183D-61 Permits to take wild birds, game birds, and game
- 17 mammals. (a) Notwithstanding subsection (b) and the other

- (1) Authorizing the taking and collecting of wild birds, game birds, and game mammals for scientific and educational purposes, or for the purpose of distributing wild birds to different localities in the State pursuant to this title;
- (2) Authorizing the keeping of wild birds in captivity for the protection, treatment for injury or disease, propagation, and other similar purposes consistent with the preservation, protection, and conservation of wild birds;
 - (3) Authorizing the taking and destruction of those wild birds, game birds, and game mammals the department may have found after investigation to be destructive to crops or to other game birds and game mammals or otherwise harmful to agriculture or aquaculture, or to constitute a nuisance or a health hazard; or
 - (4) Authorizing without requiring permits or reports, the destruction within a district of wild birds, game birds, and game mammals, including feral pigs, which

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1		are generally destructive to crops or otherwise
2		harmful to agriculture or aquaculture, or constitute a
3		nuisance or a health hazard within the district.
4	<u>(b)</u>	The department shall issue a permit for the
5	destructi	on or control of feral pigs on privately owned land if
6	the feral	pigs have caused or are likely to cause substantial
7	damage to	agricultural or aquacultural crops, indigenous plants
8	or wildli	fe, or human health and safety; provided that:
9	(1)	An authorized agent of the department shall
10		investigate a complaint filed by a private landowner
11		regarding feral pigs on the owner's land that have
12		caused or are likely to cause substantial damage. If
13		the authorized agent is satisfied that substantial
14		damage has occurred or is likely to occur, the permit
15		shall be granted;
16	(2)	No more than ninety days after a complaint is received
17		by the department, an authorized agent of the
18		department shall:
19		(A) Investigate the complaint; and
20		(B) Issue the permit; or

1		(C) Inform the applicant in writing why the permit			
2		was denied;			
3	(3)	The applicant may appeal the decision of the			
4		authorized agent to the department if the permit is			
5		denied or is otherwise not issued within ninety days;			
6	(4)	The permit shall state:			
7		(A) The species to be destroyed or controlled;			
8		(B) The approximate number of animals to be destroyed			
9		or controlled;			
10		(C) The authorized method or methods of destruction			
11		or control; and			
12		(D) Any other conditions the department deems			
13		necessary;			
14	<u>(5)</u>	Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to limit			
15		the department's authority, pursuant to subsection			
16		(a)(4), to authorize without requiring permits or			
17		reports the destruction of feral pigs within certain			
18		districts; and			
19	(6)	Nothing in this subsection shall be deemed to apply to			
20		persons who are otherwise in compliance with the			

1	State's laws and department's rules regarding game
2	mammals and hunting.
3	$[\frac{b}{c}]$ <u>(c)</u> Except as provided in subsection (a)(4), the
4	rules shall require the person or persons seeking authority to
5	apply for and obtain a written permit from the department. The
6	permits may prescribe terms and conditions the department deems
7	necessary to prevent abuse of the authority granted thereby, and
8	may be canceled by the department, after notice and hearing, for
9	the violation of any term or condition."
10	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Feral Pigs; Permitting Process; Expedited

Description:

Creates an expedited permitting process to authorize the destruction or control of feral pigs on privately owned land, if the feral pigs have caused or are likely to cause substantial damage to agricultural or aquacultural crops, indigenous plants or wildlife, or pose a threat to human health and safety.
