### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REIMBURSEMENT OF PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 78-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[ <del>[</del> ]§78-32[ <del>]</del> ] Payment of approved travel costs for public
4	officers and employees. (a) This section shall apply to all
5	approved travel costs incurred by an officer or employee of the
6	State or a county in connection with the official business of
7	the respective jurisdiction.
8	(b) Subject to subsection (d), the State and the counties
9	may pay approved travel costs directly to:
10	(1) The vendor providing the goods or services involved;
11	[ <del>or</del> ]
12	(2) The officer or employee for whom the approved travel
13	costs are to be paid, by way of a cash advance [ <del>prior</del>
14	to] <u>before</u> the date of purchase[ <del>, unless the officer</del>
15	or employee affirmatively agrees to loan the State or
16	a county the money for the travel costs and be



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1		reimbursed after the officer or employee pays for the
2		travel costs.]; or
3	(3)	The officer or employee when the officer or employee
4		affirmatively agrees to loan the State or a county the
5		money for the travel costs and be reimbursed after the
6		officer or employee pays for the travel costs.
7	(c)	This section shall not be construed as precluding the
8	reimburse	ment of approved travel costs to an officer or employee
9	upon comp	letion of travel for any costs that for any reason were
10	not paid	by the State or the county, as applicable, in
11	accordanc	e with subsection (b).
12	(d)	As pertains to the officer or employee incurring
13	approved	travel costs, whenever there is a conflict between a
14	collectiv	e bargaining agreement and this section, the terms of
15	the colle	ctive bargaining agreement shall prevail.
16	(e)	For the purposes of this section, "approved travel
17	costs" me	ans any determinable costs of travel for official state
18	or county	business approved by the respective jurisdiction and
19	supported	by a written invoice. The term includes the costs of
20	transport	ation to and from a destination point, between
21	destinati	on points, or within a destination point; event



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registration fees; per diem allowances; and any other necessary
 costs related to the travel.

3 (f) An employer shall not take adverse employment actions
4 against an officer or employee who does not affirmatively agree
5 to loan the State or a county the money for the travel costs and
6 be reimbursed after the officer or employee pays for the travel
7 costs.

8 (g) Whenever an officer or employee affirmatively agrees 9 to loan the State or a county the money for travel costs pursuant to subsection (b), the State or county shall reimburse 10 11 the officer or employee within thirty calendar days after the officer or employee requests reimbursement for the travel costs; 12 13 provided that if the State or a county is unable to reimburse 14 the officer or employee within thirty calendar days, the State 15 or a county shall pay interest of per cent of the total amount owed to the officer or employee until the loan is fully 16 17 reimbursed. Interest shall be compounded every thirty days." 18 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

## S.B. NO. 341

**Report Title:** Reimbursement; Public Employees; Travel Costs; Interest Owed

#### Description:

Requires the State or a county to reimburse an officer or employee within thirty calendar days of a request for reimbursement for travel costs that the officer or employee loaned to the State or a county. Requires the State or a county to pay a percentage of interest on the total amount owed to an officer or employee until the loan is fully reimbursed.
