8	Before adjustment of any prem	iums determined pursuant to this		
9	subsection, the department sh	all submit a report of proposed		
10	premium adjustments to the le	gislature no later than twenty days		
11	prior to the convening of eac	h regular session.		
12	(d) In order to impleme	nt the collection of premiums under		
13	this section, the department	may:		
14	(1) Develop and execute	a contract with a public or		
15	private entity to c	ollect premiums; or		
16	(2) Amend any existing	or future premium-collection		
17	contract that it ha	s executed.		
18	(e) The department shal	l adopt rules pursuant to		
19	chapter 91 necessary for the	purposes of this section, including		
20	specifying the process for di	scontinuance of eligibility under

2	by a beneficiary.
3	(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this
4	section shall be implemented only if, and to the extent that,
5	the department determines that federal financial participation
6	is available pursuant to title XIX of the federal Social
7	Security Act."
