A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the COVID-19
2	pandemic and the governmental responses to contain the spread of
3	COVID-19 have disproportionately affected certain manufacturers
4	of alcoholic beverages in the State. The frequent closure of
5	bars and clubs and prohibition of in-person dining has caused
6	these manufacturers to struggle to find alternative methods of
7	serving their customers, resulting in drastic revenue losses.
8	The legislature further finds that under state law, direct
9	business-to-consumer shipping of alcoholic beverages is limited
10	to wineries shipping wine. Thus, non-winery manufacturers are
11	prohibited from directly shipping alcoholic beverages, including
12	beer and distilled spirits, to consumers. Direct business-to-
13	consumer shipping will allow these manufacturers to serve
14	existing customers while also pursuing additional markets and
15	new customer bases. Direct business-to-consumer shipping will
16	also assist smaller manufacturers that are struggling to find
17	wholesalers willing to sell and represent the manufacturer's

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1	small brands by giving those manufacturers direct access to						
2	customers. In an effort to encourage commerce, the legislature						
3	has determined that the State must allow manufacturers to ship						
4	their goods to, from, and within the State.						
5	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow the direct						
6	shipment of beer and distilled spirits by certain licensees.						
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 281, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is						
8	amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately						
9	designated and to read as follows:						
10	"§281- Direct shipment of beer and distilled spirits by						
11	manufacturers. (a) Any person holding:						
12	(1) A general excise tax license from the department of						
13	taxation; and						
14	(2) Either:						
15	(A) A class 1, class 14, or class 18 license to						
16	manufacture beer or distilled spirits under						
17	section 281-31; or						
18	(B) A license to manufacture beer or distilled						
19	spirits issued by another state,						
20	may pay any applicable fees and obtain a direct beer and						
21	distilled spirits shipper permit from the liquor commission of						

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1	the count	y in which the beer or distilled spirits is					
2	manufactured that authorizes the holder to directly ship beer						
3	and distilled spirits to persons in any county of this State;						
4	provided that any person who holds a license to manufacture been						
5	or distilled spirits pursuant to paragraph 2(B) may obtain a						
6	direct beer and distilled spirits shipper permit from the liquon						
7	commissio	n of the county in this State to which the person will					
8	be shippi	ng beer or distilled spirits.					
9	(b)	Beginning July 1, 2025, the holder of the direct beer					
10	and distilled spirits shipper permit may sell and ship beer and						
11	distilled spirits to any person twenty-one years of age or older						
12	in any co	unty of the State for personal use only and not for					
13	resale, a	nd shall:					
14	<u>(1)</u>	Ship beer and distilled spirits directly to the person					
15		only in containers that are conspicuously labeled with					
16		the words:					
17		"CONTAINS ALCOHOL: SIGNATURE OF PERSON AGE 21 YEARS					
18		OR OLDER REQUIRED FOR DELIVERY.";					
19	(2)	Require that the carrier of the shipment obtain the					
20		signature of any person twenty-one years of age or					
21		older before delivering the shipment;					

1	<u>(3)</u>	Report no later than January 31 of each year, to the			
2		liquor commission in each county in which a direct			
3		beer and distilled spirits shipment was made, the			
4		total amount of beer and distilled spirits shipped to			
5		persons in that county during the preceding calendar			
6		year;			
7	(4)	Pay all applicable general excise and gallonage taxes.			
8		For gallonage tax purposes, all beer and distilled			
9		spirits sold under a direct beer and distilled spirits			
10		shipper permit shall be deemed to be beer and			
11		distilled spirits sold in the State; and			
12	<u>(5)</u>	Be subject to audit by the liquor commission of each			
13		county in which a direct beer and distilled spirits			
14		shipment has been made.			
15	(c)	The holder of a license to manufacture beer or			
16	distilled	spirits issued by another state may annually renew a			
17	direct beer and distilled spirits shipper permit by providing to				
18	the liquor commission that issued the permit a copy of the				
19	license and paying all required fees. The holder of a class 1,				
20	class 14, or class 18 license to manufacture beer or distilled				
21	spirits under section 281-31 may renew a direct beer and				

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- 2 applicable license by complying with all applicable laws and
- 3 paying all required fees.
- 4 (d) The sale and shipment of beer and distilled spirits
- 5 directly to a person in the State by a person that does not
- 6 possess a valid direct beer and distilled spirits shipper permit
- 7 is prohibited. Knowingly violating this section is a
- 8 misdemeanor.
- 9 (e) The liquor commission in each county shall adopt rules
- 10 necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this section;
- 11 provided that the liquor commission in each county shall ensure
- 12 that that liquor commission's respective rulemaking actions do
- 13 not interfere with, or unduly delay, the date prescribed in
- 14 subsection (b).
- 15 (f) For the purposes of this section, "distilled spirits"
- 16 shall have the same meaning as in section 244D-1."
- 17 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
