A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to article 10A, part I, to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§431:10A- Annual mental health wellness examination
5	coverage. (a) Each individual and group policy of accident and
6	health or sickness insurance issued or renewed in the State
7	after December 31, 2025, except for policies that only provide
8	coverage for a specified disease or other limited benefit
9	coverage as described in section 431:10A-607, shall provide
10	coverage for an annual mental health wellness examination;
11	provided that each covered annual mental health wellness
12	examination:
13	(1) Shall be:
14	(A) Up to sixty minutes in duration;
15	(B) Performed by a qualified mental health care
16	provider; and

1		<u>(C)</u>	Exempt from any deductible or copayment
2			provisions that may be in force in an applicable
3			policy or contract; and
4	(2)	May	include:
5		(A)	Observation;
6		<u>(B)</u>	A behavioral health screening;
7		<u>(C)</u>	Education and consultation on healthy lifestyle
8			changes;
9		(D)	Referrals for ongoing treatment, mental health
10			services, and other necessary supports;
11		(E)	Discussion of potential options for medication;
12		<u>(F)</u>	Age-appropriate screenings or observations to
13			understand a covered person's mental health
14			history, personal history, and mental or
15			cognitive state; and
16		<u>(G)</u>	If appropriate, relevant adult input through
17			screenings, interviews, and questions.

13	policy, c	ontract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after
14	January 1	, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to
15	this chap	ter, shall include benefits provided in sections
16	431:10-21	2, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116,
17	431:10A-1	16.2, 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119,

1 SECTION 4.	The	coverage	required	under	sections	1,	2,	and
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- 2 3 of this Act shall apply to all plans under Medicaid managed
- 3 care programs in the State.
- 4 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025;
- 7 provided that sections 1, 2, and 3 shall apply to all policies,
- 8 contracts, plans, or agreements issued or renewed in the State
- 9 after December 31, 2025; provided further that section 4 shall
- 10 take effect upon approval of the Hawaii medicaid state plan by
- 11 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
