SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE ARCHIVES TO EXPAND PUBLIC OUTREACH, SHARE HAWAII'S HISTORY THAT MAY PROVE RELEVANT TODAY, CREATE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION AND CIVIC ENGAGEMENT, AND EVALUATE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES TO SUPPORT ITS MISSION.

1 2	WHEREAS, the State Archives has been the keepers of public memory since 1905; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, the State Archives maintains a vast array of
5	historically significant and irreplacable records of Hawaii's
6	history, including world leading innovations and social equality
7	initiatives; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, the State Archives outgrew its original facility
10	in 1953, and has now exceeded its storage capacity for a second
11	time; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, a structural analysis of the current State
14	Archives facility conducted in 2024 found that the structure is
15	not capable of handling the realized floor loads of the original
16	expansion plans specified; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, the State Archives is currently engaged in
19	drafting a State Archives Master Plan to propose needed
20	development of a new and expanded archives facility along with
21	increasing its public programming offerings; and
22	WHEREAS, this public programming is expected to include
23 24	multi-functional educational spaces for use by teachers and
24 25	students at all levels of education; and
23 26	students at all levels of education, and
20 27	WHEREAS, there exists a strong, clear need to increase
28	understanding of Hawaii's history, increase opportunities for
29	sharing stories from Hawaii's past that may be relevant today,
30	and increase civic engagement and education; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 3 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Archives is 4 requested to expand public outreach, share Hawaii's history that 5 may prove relevant today, create new opportunities for public 6 discussion and civic engagement, including providing 7 perspectives on historical and modern issues through the lens of 8 9 different segments of the community, including women, immigrants, and Native Hawaiians, and evaluate funding 10 opportunities to support its mission; and 11

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting and General Services is requested to conduct a study on the potential for revenue generation opportunities of a new State Archives facility being developed in the State Archives Master Plan to provide a long-term source of funding for the operations and programs of the State Archives; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this study is requested to 21 consider an expanded State Archives facility which is requested 22 to include increased storage and research spaces built to last 23 for generations to come, museum grade, publicly accessible 24 display areas, multi-purpose digital classrooms, event spaces, 25 and a civics education center; and
