HB 428 Status	RELATING TO FARM TO FAMILIES. Establishes the Hawaii Farm to Families Program to alleviate food shortages in the State. Requires reports to the Legislature prior to the Regular Sessions of 2026 and 2027. Appropriates funds.	AGR, FIN
HB 967 Status	RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS. Establishes the Statewide Interagency Food Systems Coordination Team and the Interagency Food Systems Working Group within the Department of Agriculture. Requires reports to the Legislature. Establishes positions. Appropriates funds.	AGR, FIN
HB 812 Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Requires a contract for the purchase of local produce having a value of more than \$250 to be for a term of at least 5 years.	AGR, FIN
HB 1187 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.  Phases in a ban on state departments administratively attached and agencies from purchasing imported flowers and lei.	AGR, FIN

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HB 110, HD1 (HSCR40) Status

RELATING TO LOCAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

EDN, AGR, FIN

Modifies certain benchmark goals and timeline for the Department of

Education to provide locally-sourced agricultural and food products. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 328, HD1 (HSCR45) Status

RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS.

EDN, AGR, FIN

Requires the Department of Education to authorize and facilitate complex areas or individual public schools to form their own farm to school meal programs through partnerships to meet the local farm to school meal goal of thirty per cent of food served in the school to consist of locally sourced products by 2030. Allows the Department of Education to establish a plant-based meal program no later than the 2026-2027 school year. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 497, HD1 (HSCR43) Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS.

EDN, AGR, FIN

Transfers the Hawaii Child Nutrition Programs Agency from the Department of Education to the Department of Agriculture and codifies its establishment. Establishes a grant program to be administered by the Agency to support the funding of certain initiatives for the State's public schools. Appropriates funds for grants. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 773 Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, FIN

Appropriates funds for grant specialist positions to assist farmers and ranchers in meeting the requirements to receive grants offered by the United States Department of Agriculture, State, counties, or private entities.

HB 776 Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL SUPPORT.

AGR, FIN

Establishes within the Department of Agriculture the Hawaii Agricultural Transportation Assistance Program, to consist of a reimbursement program and grant program, to assist certain farmers and livestock producers with transportation costs for agricultural products, inputs, supplies, and production and distribution of agricultural commodities. Requires reports to the Legislature.

HB 782 Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, FIN

Establishes within the Department of Agriculture a working group to review and make recommendations on amending or repealing unnecessary or obsolete laws pertaining to agriculture. Appropriates funds.

HB 968 Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, FIN

Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a Healthy Soils Program. Requires an annual report to the Legislature. Appropriates

funds.

HB 984 **Status** 

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LOANS.

AGR, FIN

Updates the agricultural loan program by lowering interest rates, increasing and standardizing loan limits, and reducing the number of credit denials. Authorizes the agricultural loan program to issue lines of credit. Creates a new class of loans to encourage large scale agriculture of import replacement crops grown for the farm to state program. Appropriates funds.

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<u>HB 1393</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.	AGR, FIN
<u>Status</u>	Requires the Department of Agriculture to revitalize and enhance the agricultural statistics program to collect data on local agricultural interests. Appropriates funds.	
HB 1450 Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL CLIMATE RESILIENCY. Establishes a three-year climate-resilient food systems grant pilot program, to be administered by the Department of Agriculture. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.	AGR, FIN

#### DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
