RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

EDT, CPN/JDC

Requires businesses to clearly and conspicuously disclose the total price of all fees or charges that a consumer may have to pay for any live-event tickets or short-term lodging before the consumer consents to pay. Prohibits any business from charging a consumer any additional hidden or mandatory fees that were not disclosed before the time of purchase. Prohibits a business from offering, displaying, or advertising any covered goods or services without clearly and conspicuously disclosing the total price.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.

All testimony received by the Hawai'i Senate is posted on the Hawai'i Legislature's website, which is accessible to the public. Please do not include private information that you do not want disclosed to the public.
