<a href="#">HB 1020, HD1</a> <a href="#">(HSCR890)</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO A PROGRAM TO CHARACTERIZE CARBON SEQUESTRATION POTENTIAL AND UNDERGROUND WATER RESOURCES STATEWIDE. Establishes a Carbon Sequestration and Underground Water Resource Characterization Program via slim hole bores and requires a related statewide environmental assessment. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	EIG/AEN, WAM
