SB 1231 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PARENTAGE. Repeals the Uniform Parentage Act of 1973 and updates laws relating to parentage, including enacting portions of the Uniform Parentage Act of 2017.	JDC
SB 319 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MARIJUANA. Changes from 1 ounce to 30 grams the minimum amount of marijuana that constitutes the offense of promoting a detrimental drug in the second degree. Increases from 3 grams or less to 15 grams or less the amount of marijuana that constitutes the offense of promoting a detrimental drug in the third degree.	JDC
SB 169 Proposed SD1 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO REDRESS FOR WRONGFUL CONVICTION AND IMPRISONMENT. Requires the State to provide written notice to certain persons regarding the ability to file a claim for redress under applicable wrongful conviction law. Requires the liberal construction of that law. Establishes procedures upon reversal or vacation of conviction. Provides for advance compensation for petitioners under certain circumstances. Requires reports to Legislature from the Department of the Attorney General.
