The purpose of this informational briefing is for the Committee to receive information about the impact and legality of federal immigration enforcement efforts in Hawai'i. The briefing will address the federal administration's immigration enforcement policies and actions as they relate to Hawai'i and how they may be ignoring commonly accepted norms and violating laws.
