SB 602	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.	HSG, JHA
(HSCR1346)	Includes any parcels owned by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority as	

areas that may be closed to the public. Specifies required signage. Status

RELATING TO THE LANDLORD TENANT CODE. CPC, JHA SB 822, SD2, HD1

Establishes a three-year Residential Landlord-Tenant Code Working (HSCR1477) Group within the Department of the Attorney General. Requires an Status initial report to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2026

and a final report no later than 7/1/2028. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

SB 38, SD2, HD1 RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG, JHA

(HSCR1361) Prohibits the legislative body of a county from making imposing **Status** stricter conditions than the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation, stricter area median income requirements, or a reduction

in fee waivers to housing development proposals that would increase

the cost of the project. Effective 4/23/2057. (HD1)

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

Amends the conditions and procedures of alternative dispute resolution methods for condominium-related disputes, including the use of evaluative mediation or binding arbitration. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

SB 253, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1295) **Status**

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM RESERVES.

Requires a detailed budget summary to contain all required information without referring the reader to other portions of the budget or reserve study. Excludes the good faith defense for associations whose boards adopt a budget that omits the required detailed budget summary. Clarifies a unit owner's standing and the association's burden of proving substantial compliance. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

SB 332, SD1, HD2 (HSCR1479) Status

RELATING TO FORECLOSURES.

Prohibits sellers of mortgaged properties in a power of sale foreclosure from bundling properties at a public sale and requires each mortgaged property to be bid on separately. Specifies that the sale of a foreclosed property is not final until the earliest of either fifteen days after the public sale, if an eligible bidder submits a subsequent bid or written notice of intent to submit a subsequent bid, or forty-five days after the public sale, if an eligible bidder submits a subsequent bid. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)

SB 1343, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1289) Status

RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY REVIEW BOARD.

Amends the quorum requirements to do business and validate acts of the Small Business Regulatory Review Board. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

SB 1035, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1480) Status

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

Makes it an unfair or deceptive act or practice for businesses to: offer, display, or advertise the price of live-ticket events or short-term lodging without clearly and conspicuously disclosing the total price; and misrepresent any fees or charges in any offer, display, or advertisement for the sale of live-event tickets or short-term lodging. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

SB 438, SD2, HD2 (HSCR1487) Status

RELATING TO WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES.

Prohibits landfill units on land in an agricultural district with class A soils. Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of any waste or disposal facility for solid waste or hazardous waste on land that is near or above a significant aquifer. Clarifies that beginning July 1, 2025, the existing buffer zone between waste or disposal facilities and residential, school, or hospital property lines applies to municipal solid waste landfill units or components, construction and demolition landfill units, and their components. Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of a landfill unit within a no pass zone in a county with a population greater than five hundred thousand, with certain exemptions. Prohibits the use of fly ash, bottom ash, or a combination of fly ash and bottom ash from a municipal waste combustor for certain purposes and imposes requirements on the disposal of these materials. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)

SB 1454, SD1, HD1 RELATING TO THE WAGE AND HOUR LAW. LAB, JHA (HSCR1326) Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to issue an Status order of wage payment violation to employers found to be in violation of the State's Wage and Hour Law. Establishes penalties, enforcement, and appeal procedures. Amends the definition of "wage" to clarify that it means compensation for labor or services rendered by an employee, regardless of how it is calculated. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) RELATING TO PUBLIC MEETINGS. LAB, JHA SB 1651, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1470) Requires board packets to be posted two full business days before a public meeting. Requires boards to provide notice to persons Status requesting notification of meetings at the time the board packet is made available for public inspection. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS. SB 106, SD1, HD1 TRN, JHA (HSCR1383) Establishes a three-year Pedestrian Safety Pilot Program in a county Status with population of two hundred fifty thousand or less, under certain conditions. Authorizes the Governor to revoke and abolish the Pilot Program and overturn a county's request to opt-out of the Pilot Program. Authorizes a county with a population of over two hundred fifty thousand to participate in the Pilot Program, subject to certain conditions. Requires reports to the Legislature. Requires a driver of a vehicle to yield to a pedestrian when the pedestrian clearly indicates their intention to cross a roadway within a crosswalk. Sunsets 6/30/2028. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) RELATING TO TORTURE. SB 281, SD1, HD1 HSH, JHA (HSCR1208) Defines and prohibits the offense of torture. Makes torture a class A Status felony. (HD1) RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND SB 771, HD1 HSG, JHA (HSCR1349) DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. **Status**

Repeals the requirement that the Chairperson of the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation Board of Directors be a public member. Repeals the prohibition that certain members shall not be eligible to serve as Chairperson of the HHFDC Board of Directors. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
