**Bill Title:** HB 0864, HD1 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

**Purpose of Bill:** Allows newly graduated high school students to be eligible for workers' compensation coverage during the summer following their high school graduation while participating in Department of Education-sponsored work-based learning programs. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

**Department's Position:**

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) supports HB 864, HD1, which provides workers' compensation coverage for new high school graduates participating in Department-sponsored work-based learning programs through July 31 of the graduate's high school graduation year.

To support new high school graduates as they transition to their post-secondary plans, the Department offers work-based learning opportunities, including industry-led summer training and internships, as an extension of their Career and Technical Education program of study. Planning and preparation for these activities take place during the graduates' senior year. Extending workers' compensation coverage to new high school graduates participating in Department-approved paid or unpaid work-based learning experiences in the public or private sector provides our new graduates the same coverage as our continuing students.

The Department appreciates the Legislature's support of our work-based learning initiatives and our goal for all students to be globally competitive and locally committed. Preparing our students for the current and emerging workforce here at home will not only address our workforce needs, but will also lead to a thriving Hawaii.

The Maui Chamber of Commerce **SUPPORTS HB864 HD1** which allows newly graduated high school students to be eligible for workers' compensation coverage during the summer following their high school graduation while participating in Department of Education-sponsored work-based learning programs.

The Chamber understands that the Department of Education is actively pursuing internship opportunities for students, including those who have recently graduated from high school. However, the department has encountered a challenge: once students graduate, they are no longer considered enrolled and therefore are not covered by workers' compensation while participating in department-sponsored work-based learning opportunities during the summer following graduation.

We believe this measure will benefit businesses that wish to bring students on board for work-based learning programs without incurring the additional cost of adding a temporary employee or intern to their workers' compensation liability.
