ACCOMMODATIONS TO INCORPORATE THE PONO PLEDGE AS A REQUIREMENT FOR
GUEST CHECK-IN**

Aloha Chair Tam, Vice Chair Templo, and Members of the Committee,

The Hawai'i Tourism Authority (HTA) offers comments on HCR 143 / HR 137, which strongly urges the Hawai'i Tourism Authority to require all transient accommodations to incorporate the Pono Pledge as a requirement for guest check-in.

The HTA does not have the authority to require all transient accommodations to implement the Pono Pledge as a condition for guest check-in. Changing HTA's authority would require a legislative mandate. The County of Hawai'i and the Island of Hawai'i Visitors Bureau created the Pono Pledge specifically for Hawai'i Island. Maui has its own Mālama Maui County Pledge, while Kaua'i features The Aloha Pledge, which are similar initiatives. However, there is no official state-wide pledge. HTA's approach to informing visitors about traveling responsibly is through targeted pre- and post-arrival marketing and education efforts, raising awareness of the issues these pledges seek to address.
