In consideration of SB 1337, SD1 **RELATING TO THE STADIUM AUTHORITY.** 

Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and members of the Committee. The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) supports SB1337, SD1, which proposes amendments to Section 109-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to clarify the requirement to establish a quorum to do business and validate acts of the Stadium Authority.

The current statute is not specific on the requirement for establishing a quorum and the voting requirement to adopt a measure. The Stadium Authority board has had trouble in meeting the quorum requirement set forth in Section 92-15, HRS, due to vacancies and a lack of clarity with its application to non-voting members. This bill will clarify that a majority of the Stadium Authority's currently appointed voting members is required to do business, and the concurrence of a majority of the Stadium Authority's currently appointed voting members is required to take official action.


