Aloha Chair Elefante, Vice-Chair Wakai, and members of the committee:

I am Major General Stephen Logan, Adjutant General and Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, State of Hawaii, Department of Defense.

The Department of Defense provides testimony in **SUPPORT** of SB1382.

This measure amends the Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS), Chapter 707-711 and authorizes greater protection for Hawaii National Guard (HING) servicemembers while performing their duty in service to the State.

The HING places significant emphasis on selfless service to the State of Hawai'i, as well as on the welfare of the dedicated women and men who comprise the HING and support the State during critical times.

HING personnel and members from other states serving the State unequivocally deserve the highest level of respect and protection when faced with aggressive individuals.

During the 2023 Maui wildfires, HING servicemembers were called upon to secure the impact zones and traffic control points. This support by the HING allowed local law enforcement to concentrate on their primary duties and other vital responsibilities throughout the islands. While most interactions with the HING at these zones and points were very peaceful and without incident, our servicemembers encountered some belligerent individuals, one of whom resorted to violence against a HING servicemember.

As local law enforcement confronts capacity challenges, National Guard members will be called to provide additional support during civil disturbances, especially in critical state emergencies. Currently, the legal protections afforded to our National Guard servicemembers are inadequate, as they can only charge those who cause bodily harm with a misdemeanor.

We ask that you please support the safety of our dedicated women and men of the National Guard. They serve a vital role in upholding law and order during times of crisis, and should receive protections equal to those granted to other public servants such as fire fighters, emergency medical service providers and law enforcement officers.

If passed, the bill will authorize any intentional or deliberate act resulting in injury to National Guard members to be classified as a Class C felony, ensuring their service and sacrifices are honored and protected.
