Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and members of the Committee:

The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) strongly supports Senate Bill 401, Senate Draft 1. This bill amends Section 134-8 of Hawaii Revised Statutes to include firearms and rifles capable of firing ammunition of fifty caliber or higher in the list of prohibited weapons, while maintaining appropriate exemptions for antique pistols, revolvers, and muzzleloaders. This measure represents a significant step forward in enhancing public safety and reducing the potential for catastrophic harm in our communities. The bill recognizes the legitimate interests of collectors and historical preservation advocates by exempting antique firearms and muzzleloaders and focuses on modern high-powered weapons that present the greatest public safety concerns.

Fifty caliber firearms are exceptionally powerful weapons that pose extraordinary risks to public safety, law enforcement personnel, and critical infrastructure. These weapons are capable of penetrating light armor, vehicles, and buildings from significant distances, making them particularly dangerous in both urban and rural environments. levels of risk to public safety.

Implementation of this prohibition will enhance our ability to protect Hawaii's communities while maintaining reasonable accommodations for legitimate historical and collecting interests.

My name is Agustin Cabrera and I am a State Legislative Manager with Giffords, the gun violence prevention organization founded by former Congresswoman Gabby Giffords. I write to you today in support of SB401 which would ban firearms or rifles with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher, excluding antique pistols and revolvers, and muzzleloaders.

Fifty caliber rifles are among the most destructive weapons that may be manufactured and made legally available to civilians in the United States.

Fifty caliber rifles are military firearms, used by armed forces across the globe, that combine long range, accuracy, and massive firepower. A 50 caliber rifle can hit a target accurately from distances of 1,000 to 2,000 yards, depending on the skill of the shooter, and can reach targets at an even longer range, sacrificing accuracy.¹ Designed for use in urban combat situations, 50 caliber rifles can penetrate structures and destroy or disable light armored vehicles, radar dishes, helicopters, stationary, and taxiing airplanes, and other "high-value" military targets.²

The destructive power of the 50 caliber rifle can be magnified by the use of certain types of ammunition that are legal under federal law (although banned in some states). In addition to the standard "ball" round of 50 caliber ammunition, armor-piercing, incendiary, and combination armor-piercing and incendiary ammunition for 50 caliber rifles can significantly enhance their destructive capacity.

50 caliber rifles can be particularly dangerous when made available on the open market

Despite these firearms' capability for destruction, 50 caliber rifles are generally regulated no differently from other rifles or shotguns and are subject to less regulation than handguns in most states and under federal law.³ In fact, under federal law and the laws of nearly all states, any 18-year-old who passes a background check can buy a 50 caliber rifle.8 In addition, because federal law and the laws of most states do not require private sellers to conduct background checks, criminals can easily obtain 50 caliber rifles at gun shows and elsewhere.

Other states have taken steps to increase security regarding the use of 50 caliber weapons

California, Illinois, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia generally ban .50 caliber rifles, while Connecticut bans a single model of .50 caliber rifle. Maryland imposes various regulations on transfers of

50 caliber rifles. Despite the risks inherent in the use of 50 caliber handguns, no state bans 50 caliber handguns as of yet. However, Hawaii can take the opportunity to strengthen their gun violence prevention framework by ensuring they can protect their communities from these strong and dangerous weapons. With the risks so great, we urge the committee to support SB401.

I write to you today as the President of the Hawaii Rifle Association and as a lifelong advocate for responsible firearm ownership. On behalf of our members across the state, I urge you to reject Senate Bill 401 (SB 401), a measure that unfairly targets law-abiding citizens while doing nothing to address the criminal misuse of firearms.

SB 401 seeks to implement an outright ban on larger caliber firearms, including widely used rifles and handguns such as .50 BMG rifles, .500 Smith & Wesson revolvers, and .50-caliber pistols like the Desert Eagle. I stand in **OPPOSITION** to this bill. This ban on .50 Caliber firearms is attempting to solve a problem that does not exist. We do not have gangs shooting at each other from long distances with .50 caliber rifles. The state has failed to produce any evidence that there is a threat posed by such arms over the past five years since a similar measure had been introduced. It is irresponsible to maintain any attempt to ban a device whereby there is no proven threat vector.

There are many weapons that would fall under this ban, many of them are used for hunting. Including many handgun calibers. **This bill would also effectively ban nearly all shotguns** as all but the smallest (.410 bore) are larger than .50 caliber. 12 Gauge shotguns and flareguns can even chamber .50 caliber ammunition, despite the risk of doing such a thing.

The Supreme Court also said in **Caetano** and **Heller** that bans on arms that are in common use for lawful purposes are unconstitutional. Just like tasers cannot be banned, .50 caliber arms cannot be banned and there are FAR more .50 caliber arms legally out there than tasers.

This bill is founded on pure ignorance, for lack of a better word. The author mistakenly believes that all .50 caliber guns are machine guns and can penetrate the armor of a tank from impossible distances or make commercial airliners explode with a single shot and has stated so publicly, and they think the guns can do this simply because the caliber is .50.

This is all simply not true, not only are not all .50 caliber bullets the same, with some being fairly weak pistol rounds to ones coming close but still so far away from the Mythos surrounding the magical '50 cal'.

I would also like to point out that the ban on Teflon coated bullets is a farce. Teflon coating does not make a bullet armor piercing. When Teflon coated bullets were first designed, the designer simply hypothesized that the coating would improve the bullet's 'grip' on certain surfaces like glass or painted metal, and thus allow the bullet to penetrate rather than deflecting off an angled surface like a car windshield.

This hypothesis was later proven false with further testing and even found that the effectiveness of armor penetrating rounds was actually reduced slightly by Teflon coatings. Teflon coatings were still used because they found the coating significantly reduced wear and tear on firearm barrels during testing and was worth the minor performance reduction. This however has not stopped those who choose to believe the myth from passing and keeping laws like these.

I strongly urge you to oppose SB401 and prevent this dangerously vague and overreaching legislation from being enacted. Aloha,

I am writing today to express why I am opposed to SB401. I am writing to educate and encourage this committee to see how unnecessary this bill is for Hawai'i and the United States for that matter. Hawai'i has an extremely low number of crimes committed with firearms. This is thankfully due to the way of life and choices of the people here, far more so than the laws created to hinder certain firearm ownership. Facts should not be ignored when making laws to prevent violent crime. The facts in regards to this bill is that is wholesomely unnecessary and in fact unconstitutional. I will prove my claims later in this testimony and ask you to please do your duty and read this entire testimony and see that this is if fact unconstitutional and should not be passed.

First let's define the .50 caliber firearms being discussed in the bill, specifically those that would be banned. The .50 caliber BMG is used with a rifle platform. The 50 caliber handgun load is used with various modern handguns that are widely in circulation and are commonly owned. Both would be banned by this bill if it becomes law in addition to most all shotguns. Neither the .50 BMG nor any .50-caliber handguns are widely used in crimes and that is a fact. In fact, in an attempt to refute a 2004 statement from an NRA spokesperson that "The simple fact is that .50-calibers have not been used in crimes.", the Violence Policy Center lists a long list of criminals and crimes where a .50-caliber firearm or round was found, but there were only four cases in the United States, since the early 1990s, where a .50-caliber firearm was actually used to commit a crime. Most importantly, none of those crimes were in Hawai'i. I firmly believe anti-gun lawmakers within Hawai'i work to continue to chip away at rights regarding gun ownership each year. They prove that in any small, even meaningless bill that becomes law, they feel vindicated in their efforts at disarming honest Americans. This disheartens firearms owners and discourages us from speaking out as it is burdensome and time consuming and breaks us all down little by little.

Last year when this bill was being heard (it was not passed then) KHON2 reporters asked Karl Rhoads why the .50 caliber "should be banned if criminals do not often use them," a point not even lost on the reporter for the station. "Because it's a weapon of war," Rhoads told the channel. "All these gun bills are drawing lines. There's a kitchen knife on this side, and there's a nuclear weapon on this side. So, where is it that you allow civilians to keep having it?" Just so you're aware Mr. Roads, the second amendment was not written strictly for hunting. God forbid our people would have to one day use firearms to protect us from an invading force but if we did, a disarmed society would be far easier to take control of and an armed population could be a defining factor in remaining a free nation. Recreational range/ sport shooting, plus defense against threats foreign and domestic are integral factors to keeping this nation safe, as clarified within the 2nd amendment. The United States Constitution is very clear and has been even further clarified for all within multiple Supreme Court cases favoring those who hold my beliefs that the second amendment is necessary for this nation. This right is not to be infringed. This is an inalienable right and is not a privilege. This right isn't granted by the government, it is recognized as something granted by God.

As per the Supreme Court Bruen decision, this bill must pass two standards, that I will prove that it fails in both in order to be seen as consistent with the United States Constitution. The first of the two standards is if a firearm is both unusual and dangerous, and the second requirement is if the law matches historical intentions and laws of the land based on the founding father's intentions. The first point of review is that all firearms have some form of danger but they must be scrutinized as whether or not they are unusual and not something seen in the hands of the civilian population. Nuclear bombs would be both dangerous and unusual and would in fact fail the Bruen standards and could be banned from civilian use. The .50 caliber firearm though is something used in this nation widely by citizens throughout the entirety of American history. They are not unusual and are commonly owned by Americans and many of those located in the state of Hawai'i. They are not unusual and dangerous so they fail the first test under the Supreme Court Bruen decision. They are in fact useful for hunting wild boar when a knife and dogs isn't enough for protecting a boar hunter in Hawai'i specifically. I have encountered fully grown wild boar first hand and I doubt many in this committee have themselves. This tool saves lives and is perfectly useful for that purpose. Anyone who says otherwise is either ignorant or lying. The second point of scrutiny under of this bill would be in regards to historical precedent. This bill does not pass muster there either. This was a common caliber for firearms, hence the addition within this bill to exclude antique .50 caliber firearms. This bill is unconstitutional and will fail when brought to the Supreme Court.

This bill will also fail when examined alongside the Colombia v. Heller and Caetano v. Massachusetts cases. In the Heller decision clears up the the 2nd amendment is an individual right, and allows us to protect ourselves not just within our homes but throughout the nation. The arms are protected and necessary for this right to be honored. The Caetano case allowed the carry of a stun gun as it was a arm that was commonly used throughout the nation with over 200,000 in circulation. These firearms being proposed to be banned far outnumber that number and these facts should not be ignored. The fact alone that this bill recognizes that antique firearms must be made an exception from this ban proves that these are common caliber firearms used for centuries in this nation and fully intended to be protected by the 2nd amendment. This body should not be working to tear down the 2nd amendment and should consider legal cases such as these when attempting to take away rights of law abiding Americans citizens.

The costs incurred in tax dollars spent defending an unconstitutional bill could be far better spent on actual firearm education, medical/ mental health care for Hawai'i citizens and even free firearm safety programs throughout all islands that people can attend for free at all ages. A new approach should be considered. Something that addresses the issues and not the tools used. Make our islands safer while not demonizing law abiding citizens and ignoring the actual problems. I am writing today to express why I am opposed to SB401. This bill is unnecessary for Hawai'i and will not make anyone safer. Hawai'i has an extremely low number of crimes committed with firearms and that is a great fact. Facts should not be ignored when making laws to prevent violent crime. The facts in regards to this bill is that is wholesomely unnecessary and in fact unconstitutional. I will prove my claims later in this testimony and ask you to please do your duty and read this entire testimony and see that this is if fact unconstitutional and should not be passed.

First let's define the .50 caliber firearms being discussed in the bill, specifically those that would be banned. First off, it bans all shotguns by way of ignorance of firearms via the authors of the bill. A .50 caliber shotgun could be used to fire a .50 caliber round. This wouldn't be smart to do so and most of the powder wouldn't burn and it would be significantly less useful but it can be used with that round so this de facto would ban all 12 gauge shotguns by way of ignorance or possibly as intended by the authors. The .50 caliber BMG is used with a rifle platform and is the most common but not only .50 caliber rifle. A 50 baeowolf round is also common and would be made illegal to possess with this bill. The 50 caliber round designed for a handgun is used with various modern handguns that are widely in circulation and are commonly owned. All three types of firearms would be banned by this bill if it becomes law. Neither the .50 BMG nor any .50-caliber handguns are widely used in crimes and that is a fact. I would go out on a limb to say not one crime ever has been committed with a shotgun with .50 caliber ammunition yet it would be banned by this bull. In fact, in an attempt to refute a 2004 statement from an NRA spokesperson that "The simple fact is that .50-calibers have not been used in crimes.", the Violence Policy Center lists a gives a list of criminals and crimes where a .50-caliber firearm or round was found, but there were only four cases in the United States, since the early 1990s, where a .50-caliber firearm was actually used to commit a crime. Most importantly, none of those crimes were in Hawai'i. I firmly believe anti-gun lawmakers within Hawai'i work to continue to chip away at rights regarding gun ownership each year. This is a death by a thousand cuts tactic designed to dissuade and diminish opposition and to make lawmakers used to the process of removing rights in an attempt to make it easier for them to choose to do again in the future. Regardless of how small, even meaningless a gun bill that becomes law, they feel vindicated in their efforts at disarming honest Americans.

Last year when this bill was presented and did not pass. Also the year before. The United States Constitution is very clear. This right is not to be infringed. This is an inalienable right and is not a privilege. This right isn't granted by the government, it is recognized as something granted by God.

As per the Supreme Court Bruen decision, this bill must pass two standards, and I will prove that it fails in both in order to be seen as consistent with the United States Constitution. The first of the two standards is if a firearm is both unusual and dangerous, and the second requirement is if the law matches historical intentions and laws of the land based on the founding father's intentions. The first point of review is that all firearms have some form of danger but they must be scrutinized as whether or not they are unusual and not something seen in the hands of the civilian population. Nuclear bombs would be both dangerous and unusual and would in fact fail the Bruen standards and could be banned from civilian use. The .50 caliber firearm though is something used in this nation widely by citizens throughout the entirety of American history. They are not unusual and are commonly owned by Americans and many of those located in the state of Hawai'i. They are not unusual and dangerous so they fail the first test under the Supreme Court Bruen decision. They are in fact useful for hunting wild boar when a knife and dogs isn't enough for protecting a boar hunter in Hawai'i specifically. I have encountered fully grown wild boar first hand and I doubt many in this committee have themselves. This tool saves lives and is perfectly useful for that purpose. My name is Bronson Teixeira, I'm 37 years old and I'm born and raised on the island of Maui, I would like to thank you for giving me the opportunity to voice my opinion and stand strongly opposing sb308 and sb401. In my written testimony I shall cover my opinions on why I oppose this bill, common available facts, the consequences of this bill does if it goes into effect, and some solutions.

I believe the issue we face in America today is not the so called "gun violence", but rather it is a mental health issue and a gang/crime violence issue as well as the lack of punishment in the judicial system. I don't understand how one can blame a mechanical device or a tool and let's keep in mind that it requires someone to pull the trigger and because of these actions of some individuals us law abiding individuals are being punished by them wanting to take away an excellent sporting rifle. It's kind of like blaming the automobile instead of the drunk driver for killing an innocent family, it just doesn't make any sense.

As of 2022 firearm related deaths have been on a slow decline. ALL LONG GUNS that's including SEMIAUTOMATIC, BOLT ACTION, AND SHOTGUNS combined make up around ONLY 4% of that firearm homicides. I would also like to mention the fact that the Opioid and Fentanyl epidemic kills over double the amount of firearms, that's well over 100,000 people killed by these drugs. It is a fact that KNIVES, HAMMERS, and the HUMAN Hands kill more Americans per year than these types of firearms.

Now if we were to look and agree on the data and facts that are given above its safe to say we can clearly see that guns are not the issue, societal changes, economic landscape, suicide,

This bill places restrictions on legal gun owners while failing to address the root causes of gun violence.

3. Second Amendment Concerns

This legislation's broad scope infringes upon Hawaii's citizens' constitutional rights. The Second Amendment protects the right to keep and bear arms, and overly restrictive laws like SB 401 SD1 could face significant legal challenges. Courts have consistently ruled against blanket prohibitions on firearms commonly used for lawful purposes.

4. Exemptions for Antique Firearms and Muzzleloaders Highlight Arbitrary Standards

While the bill excludes antique pistols, revolvers, and muzzleloaders, the distinction is arbitrary. Modern .50 caliber firearms serve purposes beyond military applications, including precision shooting and hunting. Restricting ownership based solely on caliber size rather than criminal behavior is an ineffective and unjustified approach.

5. Focus Should Be on Criminal Behavior, Not Legal Firearm Ownership

Instead of imposing broad firearm bans, the legislature should focus on measures that address illegal gun trafficking, mental health support, and crime prevention initiatives. Targeting law-abiding gun owners does not improve public safety but diverts attention from policies that would meaningfully reduce violence.

I respectfully urge you to vote **against** SB 401 SD1 for these reasons. Rather than enacting ineffective firearm bans, I encourage the legislature to pursue evidence-based policies that address crime at its root causes while respecting the rights of responsible gun owners.

Testimony in Opposition to Senate Bill 401

Chairperson, Vice Chair, and Committee Members,

I respectfully submit this testimony in strong opposition to Senate Bill 401, which seeks to ban any firearm or rifle with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher. This legislation is unnecessary, unconstitutional, and lacks clarity on its enforcement and impact on law-abiding citizens.

Constitutional Concerns

- In *District of Columbia v. Heller* (2008), the U.S. Supreme Court affirmed that the Second Amendment protects firearms "in common use" for lawful purposes, including self-defense.
- Many firearms chambered in .50 caliber or higher, including 12-gauge shotguns, are widely used for hunting, sport shooting, and home defense.
- A caliber-based ban is an arbitrary restriction that does not align with constitutional protections.

Criminalizing Law-Abiding Citizens

- SB 401 lacks provisions on what existing firearm owners are supposed to do with firearms that would suddenly be deemed illegal.
- Without a clear grandfathering clause, law-abiding citizens who have legally purchased and registered these firearms would be turned into criminals overnight simply for possessing previously legal firearms.
- This bill disproportionately affects responsible gun owners who have followed every regulation and background check process required by Hawaii's already strict laws.
- The government should not be in the business of turning law-abiding citizens into felons based on an arbitrary caliber classification rather than actual misuse of firearms.

Lack of Criminal Misuse

- FBI Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) data shows that .50 caliber rifles have been virtually absent from violent crime statistics. Between 2010 and 2020, there were **zero reported homicides** involving a .50 caliber rifle in the United States.
- The 12-gauge shotgun, which fires ammunition above the .50 caliber threshold, is among the most commonly owned firearms in the U.S., with **over 10 million in circulation**. Despite this, shotguns of all types were used in only **264 homicides in 2019**, compared to **6,368 with handguns** (FBI UCR 2019).
- A ban on firearms based on caliber rather than actual criminal usage is ineffective and punishes responsible gun owners rather than criminals.

Hawaii's Existing Strict Gun Laws

- Hawaii already has some of the most restrictive firearm regulations in the country, including mandatory permits, background checks, and registration requirements.
- Further bans on law-abiding gun owners do not address the root causes of violent crime.
- Instead of ineffective firearm bans, resources should be directed toward enforcing existing laws and addressing criminal behavior.

Conclusion

- SB 401 unfairly targets responsible gun owners while doing nothing to enhance public safety.
- The bill lacks clear provisions on what firearm owners are supposed to do with their nowprohibited firearms, effectively turning law-abiding citizens into criminals overnight.
- The bill contradicts *Heller* and is not supported by empirical crime data.
- I urge the committee to reject SB 401 and focus on solutions that genuinely improve public safety.

This bill, effective January 1, 2026, adds firearms and rifles capable of firing .50 caliber or higher ammunition to Hawaii's list of prohibited weapons (Section 1), targeting law-abiding citizens while ignoring real threats. As a MAGA Republican, I see this as an egregious attack on freedom, but I also call on Democrats—who value equity, public safety, and practical solutions—to reject this bill for its unfairness and ineffectiveness.

1. A Direct Assault on Second Amendment Freedoms

This bill bans firearms firing .50 caliber or higher ammunition, stripping law-abiding citizens of their constitutional right to bear arms suited for self-defense or lawful recreation (Section 1). There is no grandfather clause and thus, anyone who owns shotguns, incredibly common firearms, will be turned into felons overnight. Despite constantly educating lawmakers on this major flaw there seems to be an insistence on forcing a ban through.

Moreover, the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS), through the NYSRPA vs. Bruen decision (2022), recently established "text, history, and tradition" as the new standard for jurisprudence regarding the Second Amendment. SB401 provides no historical analogs to justify its consideration. Reaching further back, the SCOTUS decision in District of Columbia vs. Heller (2008) noted that arms in common use for lawful purposes cannot be banned. Shotguns are considered arms, by definition, and thus a ban on them is, by and large, an arms ban. SB401 demonstrates a blatant disregard of numerous SCOTUS decisions and should not be considered for approval.

I Jason T Wolford am writing to express my strong opposition to SB401, which seeks to prohibit the manufacture, possession, sale, or transfer of firearms capable of firing ammunition of .50 caliber or higher. While I understand the intent behind this legislation, it is both unconstitutional and harmful to law-abiding citizens who responsibly exercise their Second Amendment rights.

Legal Precedent: Firearms in Common Use Cannot Be Banned

The United States Supreme Court has repeatedly affirmed that firearms in common use for lawful purposes cannot be outright banned. The landmark cases **District of Columbia v. Heller (2008)** and **McDonald v. City of Chicago (2010)** explicitly recognize the individual right to keep and bear arms. Furthermore, in **New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen (2022)**, the Court reinforced that gun restrictions must align with historical tradition and cannot impose broad prohibitions on commonly owned firearms.

Many rifles and firearms chambered in .50 caliber, including those used for sport shooting and hunting, are commonly owned by responsible gun owners across the country. As such, banning these firearms violates the standard set forth in **Heller**, which prohibits bans on "arms in common use at the time for lawful purposes."

SB401 Will Ban Many Shotguns Capable of Firing .50 Caliber Slugs

SB401's broad language would also inadvertently ban many commonly owned shotguns. Standard 12-gauge shotguns are widely used for hunting, sport shooting, and home defense, and they are capable of firing a **slug round** that exceeds .50 caliber in diameter.

Shotguns are designed to fire both shot (multiple projectiles) and slugs (a single, large projectile), with many slug loads measuring **.72 caliber or larger**—far exceeding the .50 caliber threshold set by this bill. If SB401 is passed, thousands of legally owned shotguns would be deemed illegal, making responsible gun owners criminals overnight simply for possessing their lawfully acquired firearms.

SB401 Criminalizes Law-Abiding Citizens

This bill would create instant criminals out of law-abiding citizens who currently possess these firearms. SB401 does not contain any **grandfather clause** for individuals who legally own these firearms today, meaning that lawful owners would either have to surrender their property to the state or face criminal prosecution.

Under existing Hawaii firearm laws, **illegal possession of a prohibited firearm is a Class C felony**, which carries penalties including:

- Up to 5 years in prison
- Hefty fines
- Permanent loss of firearm rights

Such severe penalties for the mere possession of legally owned firearms would disproportionately impact responsible gun owners while doing nothing to reduce violent crime.

What Happens to Those Who Currently Own These Firearms?

SB401 fails to outline any process for current legal owners of .50 caliber firearms to retain their property. If passed, owners would likely face the following scenarios:

- **Mandatory surrender or confiscation** of their legally owned firearms, potentially without compensation.
- **Legal uncertainty**, as citizens who comply with current law may suddenly be in violation simply by owning something they purchased lawfully.
- **Risk of criminal prosecution**, fines, and imprisonment for keeping firearms that were legal at the time of purchase.

This lack of clarity and fairness would create confusion and legal jeopardy for thousands of lawabiding citizens.

Conclusion: SB401 Must Be Rejected

Rather than targeting responsible gun owners, legislative efforts should focus on enforcing existing laws against criminals who misuse firearms. This bill is unconstitutional under Supreme Court precedent, criminalizes responsible gun owners, bans common shotguns due to their ability to fire .50 caliber slugs, and fails to address what will happen to law-abiding citizens who currently own these firearms.

I urge you to oppose SB401 and instead support legislation that upholds the constitutional rights of Hawaii's citizens while focusing on actual solutions to violent crime. Thank you for your time and consideration.

Aloha Mai Kākou, Honorable Members of the Senate,

I am Tiare Smith, a Native Hawaiian resident of Kahalu'u, O'ahu, where I have lived for 45 years, deeply embedded in the cultural and communal fabric of this island. It is from this vantage point—steeped in the values of our kūpuna and the realities of rural life—that I submit my unequivocal opposition to SB401, a bill amending Section 134-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to prohibit firearms or rifles capable of firing ammunition of fifty caliber or higher, effective January 1, 2026. While the intent to enhance public safety is ostensibly noble, this measure is a precipitous overreach, riddled with practical flaws and antithetical to the rights and needs of Hawaii's diverse populace. I urge its rejection on the following grounds.

First, SB401's blanket prohibition on firearms of fifty caliber or higher—excluding only antique pistols, revolvers, and muzzleloaders—demonstrates a disconcerting lack of nuance, imperiling lawful activities integral to our state's heritage and sustenance. In rural communities like Kahalu'u, large-caliber firearms serve legitimate purposes: hunting invasive species such as feral pigs, which devastate native ecosystems, and ensuring personal security in areas where law enforcement response times are protracted. By indiscriminately banning these tools, the bill disenfranchises residents who rely on them not for malice, but for survival and stewardship of our 'āina. The exemption for muzzleloaders, while a nod to tradition, is a hollow gesture—such weapons are impractical for the modern demands of land management.

Second, the legislation's scope betrays an intellectual inconsistency that undermines its purported aim. By targeting caliber size rather than specific misuse, SB401 casts an overly broad net, ensnaring law-abiding citizens while failing to address the root causes of firearm-related harm. Hawaii's existing laws—among the strictest in the nation—already regulate automatic weapons, silencers, and explosives with precision. Adding fifty-caliber firearms to this list, absent evidence of their widespread abuse in our state, smacks of performative governance rather than data-driven policy. The Department of the Attorney General's own statistics reveal firearm violence here is overwhelmingly tied to handguns, not high-caliber rifles. This mismatch renders SB401 an ineffectual distraction from targeted solutions.

Third, the bill encroaches upon individual liberties in a manner antithetical to the spirit of selfdetermination that defines our island identity. For Native Hawaiians and other rural residents, the right to responsibly bear arms is not merely a constitutional abstraction but a practical extension of our sovereignty over our lives and lands. SB401's unilateral disarmament of these tools— without consultation or cultural consideration—echoes a colonial imposition, stripping us of agency under the guise of protection. Such paternalism erodes trust in governance, particularly in communities already wary of top-down edicts that disregard local context.

Finally, the implementation of SB401 risks exacerbating enforcement disparities, further straining an overburdened system. With no grandfather clause or compensation mechanism articulated, law-abiding owners face abrupt criminalization or coerced divestment of legally acquired property. This not only invites legal challenges but also diverts scarce resources— police, courts, and administrative oversight—from addressing actual threats to public safety. In a state where fiscal prudence is paramount, such a measure is an imprudent gamble on unproven gains.

As a Native Hawaiian who has witnessed O'ahu's transformation over nearly half a century, I implore you to reject SB401. It is not a safeguard but a misstep—an ill-conceived restriction that alienates rather than protects, and diminishes rather than empowers. Let us instead refine our laws with precision, honoring the balance between safety and liberty that Hawaii's people deserve. Mahalo nui loa for your attention to this matter.

I am writing to express my strong opposition to SB401 which would be the proposed ban on .50 caliber or higher firearms. I firmly believe that such a ban would be an overreach and would not meaningfully address the real issues of gun violence in our country. Instead, it would infringe upon the rights of law-abiding citizens and fail to achieve the desired outcomes.

1. Misunderstanding of .50 Caliber Firearms

A .50 caliber firearm is not the type of weapon typically used in crimes of passion, street violence, or even mass shootings. These are specialized, high-powered rifles primarily used for long-range shooting, hunting, and sport shooting. The vast majority of .50 caliber firearm owners use them responsibly and for lawful purposes such as recreational shooting, collecting, and target practice. Banning these firearms would disproportionately impact responsible gun owners without addressing the types of weapons commonly used in violent crimes.

2. Rare Use in Crimes

The reality is that .50 caliber or higher firearms are exceedingly rare in criminal activity. They are not the firearms of choice for criminals or those committing violent acts. Handguns and assault-style rifles are much more commonly involved in gun violence. By focusing on a narrow segment of firearms, such as .50 caliber or higher rifles, the proposed ban ignores the broader issue of illegal firearms and criminal behavior.

3. Second Amendment Rights

The Second Amendment of the United States Constitution guarantees the right of the people to keep and bear arms. Banning .50 caliber firearms or similar weapons infringes on this constitutional right. While there are certainly valid arguments for regulating certain types of firearms, the government must balance this with the preservation of individual rights. The right to own firearms, including large-caliber rifles, is protected under the Constitution. A blanket ban on firearms based solely on caliber disregards the rights of law-abiding citizens to legally own and use firearms for legitimate purposes.

4. Ineffectiveness of a Caliber-Specific Ban

These firearms are important tools for certain types of competitive shooting and specialized hunting, and banning them would unfairly limit the rights of individuals who use them for lawful, recreational purposes.

In considering the Barrett line of 50 caliber rifles, retail prices range from \$5,000 to \$13,000, weigh from 23 to 31.4 pounds and have an overall length 48"". Ammunition for these rifles range \$4.00 to \$11.00 for each round. So how many of Hawaii's run of the mill criminals are going to be able to afford one of these weapons much less want to hump one around to commit a crime.

Lastly, where are the statistics to support this bill. How many of the weapons in this bill have been used to commit crimes in Hawaii? How many people have been killed or injured by these weapons in our state? If these weapons were such a threat, I would expect that DLE or HPD would readily put forth the numbers.

SB401 is just another what if legislative feel good bill that does not deserve passage.

(b) In developing such proposed plan of action, the Attorney General shall review, at a minimum:

(i) All Presidential and agencies' actions from January 2021 through January 2025 that purport to promote safety but may have impinged on the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens;

(ii) Rules promulgated by the Department of Justice, including by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, from January 2021 through January 2025 pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;

(iii) Agencies' plans, orders, and actions regarding the so-called "enhanced regulatory enforcement policy" pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;

(iv) Reports and related documents issued by the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention;

(v) The positions taken by the United States in any and all ongoing and potential litigation that affects or could affect the ability of Americans to exercise their Second Amendment rights;

(vi) Agencies' classifications of firearms and ammunition; and

(vii) The processing of applications to make, manufacture, transfer, or export firearms.

Sec. 3. Implementation. Upon submission of the proposed plan of action described in section 2 of this order, the Attorney General shall work with the Domestic Policy Advisor to finalize the plan of action and establish a process for implementation.

Sec. 4. General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

(i) the authority granted by law to an executive department, agency, or the head thereof; or

(ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.

(b) This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.

(c) This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

President Trumps Executive Order simply states that Firearms have been used since the founding of our great Republic for the protection of ourselves, our families and our freedom, and is the foundation for all the other rights we as American hold dear, the rights of the people must not be infringed.

I respectfully submit this testimony in opposition to SB401, particularly its provision prohibiting the manufacture, possession, sale, barter, trade, gift, transfer, or acquisition of any firearm or rifle with the capacity to fire ammunition of .50 caliber or higher. While I support efforts to ensure public safety, this specific ban is overly broad, lacks evidence-based justification, and unfairly impacts law-abiding Hawaii residents.

Firearms chambered in .50 caliber, such as the .50 BMG, are primarily used by enthusiasts for legitimate purposes like long-range target shooting and competitive marksmanship. These activities are well-established in the shooting sports community and pose no inherent threat to public safety when conducted responsibly. The rifles themselves are large, heavy, and expensive—hardly the weapons of choice for criminal activity. In fact, there is little to no data showing that .50 caliber firearms are disproportionately involved in crimes in Hawaii or elsewhere.

Moreover, this blanket prohibition fails to distinguish between lawful use and misuse. Lawabiding owners—hunters, collectors, and sport shooters—would be penalized without clear evidence that banning these firearms addresses any specific safety concern in our state. The ban also overlooks the rigorous federal regulations already in place for firearms, which include background checks and serial number tracking, ensuring accountability for owners.

The .50 caliber ammunition targeted by this bill is similarly misunderstood. It is designed for precision and power over long distances, not for the kind of rapid, close-quarters misuse often associated with gun violence. Criminals typically favor smaller, more concealable weapons, not the bulky, specialized firearms SB401 seeks to outlaw. Without data linking .50 caliber firearms or ammunition to crime in Hawaii, this ban appears to be a solution in search of a problem.

I am submitting this written testimony in strong opposition to Senate Bills 401 and 308, both of which seek to impose a ban on so-called "high-caliber" firearms and restrict magazine capacities to ten rounds or fewer. These bills represent an overbroad and unconstitutional infringement on the rights of law-abiding citizens, lack a substantial basis in crime prevention, and impose undue burdens on individuals who responsibly exercise their Second Amendment rights.

1. Constitutional Concerns The proposed legislation violates fundamental constitutional protections guaranteed under the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution, as well as Article I, Section 17 of the Hawaii State Constitution. The U.S. Supreme Court has repeatedly affirmed, most notably in *District of Columbia v. Heller* (2008) and *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen* (2022), that firearm restrictions must be consistent with the nation's historical tradition of firearm regulation. A ban on so-called "high-caliber" weapons and standard-capacity magazines does not meet this legal standard.

2. Lack of Empirical Support for Crime Reduction The assumption that these bans will meaningfully reduce violent crime is not supported by empirical data. Studies, including those from the U.S. Department of Justice, have shown that magazine capacity restrictions have no measurable effect on crime rates. Criminals, by definition, do not adhere to firearm regulations, and restrictions such as those proposed in SB401 and SB308 disproportionately burden lawful gun owners without addressing the root causes of violent crime.

3. Disproportionate Impact on Law-Abiding Citizens Many commonly owned firearms—used for lawful purposes such as self-defense, hunting, and sporting—fall under the vague and arbitrary restrictions proposed in these bills. The majority of modern firearms, including those utilized by millions of Americans, come standard with magazines exceeding ten rounds. Restricting magazine capacity disadvantages law-abiding individuals in self-defense scenarios, particularly against multiple attackers, while providing no tangible public safety benefit.

4. Enforcement Challenges and Legal Liabilities If enacted, SB401 and SB308 would present serious enforcement difficulties, potentially criminalizing thousands of otherwise law-abiding citizens for possessing firearms and magazines that have been legally owned for

decades. This raises concerns regarding ex post facto laws, due process violations, and potential Fifth Amendment takings claims. Moreover, it places an undue burden on law enforcement agencies that should be focusing on criminal activity rather than regulating responsible firearm ownership.

Conclusion Public safety is of paramount importance, and we all share a common goal of reducing unlawful violence. However, SB401 and SB308 are misguided measures that will do little to enhance public safety while significantly infringing upon the constitutional rights of Hawaii's citizens. I urge this committee to reject these bills and instead focus on policies that address criminal behavior rather than penalizing law-abiding residents.

Testimony in Opposition to SB401

Hawaii State Legislature

Honorable Chair, Vice-Chair, and Members of the Committee,

I respectfully submit this testimony in **strong opposition** to Senate Bill 401, which seeks to ban firearms and rifles capable of firing .50 caliber or higher ammunition. While I recognize the intent behind this legislation, it fails to accomplish its stated goal of improving public safety. Instead, it **unjustly restricts the rights of law-abiding citizens, does nothing to prevent criminals from accessing firearms, and exposes the state to costly legal challenges that burden taxpayers without any demonstrable public benefit.**

SB401 Does Not Deter Crime or Disarm Criminals

One of the most fundamental issues with SB401 is that it does **not** address how criminals obtain or use firearms. According to data from the **U.S. Department of Justice**, criminals overwhelmingly acquire firearms through **illegal means**—including theft, straw purchases, and black-market sales.

If this bill's intent is truly to enhance public safety, it should focus on policies that **target criminals** rather than law-abiding citizens. Measures such as:

- Harsher penalties for crimes committed with a firearm
- Increased law enforcement efforts to crack down on illegal firearm trafficking
- Strengthening mental health and intervention programs

would be far more effective than a **broad and arbitrary ban on a specific firearm caliber that is not commonly used in crimes.**

Fact: .50 Caliber Firearms Are Rarely Used in Crime

Despite their portrayal as "high-powered" weapons, .50 caliber firearms are **not commonly used in violent crimes.** FBI crime data indicates that:

- The overwhelming majority of gun-related crimes involve handguns, not rifles or large-caliber firearms.
- .50 caliber rifles, such as the Barrett M82, are **expensive and difficult to conceal**, making them **impractical for criminal use**.

Simply put, banning these firearms does nothing to **address the real sources of gun violence in our communities.**

The Right to Self-Defense & Hawaii's Emergency Response Delays

A core principle of the **Second Amendment** is the right to **self-defense**. The **U.S. Supreme Court** has repeatedly affirmed that citizens have a constitutional right to bear arms for lawful purposes, including the protection of **themselves**, **their families**, **and their property**.

This right is particularly **critical in Hawaii**, where **emergency response times can be dangerously delayed** due to the state's geography and law enforcement staffing challenges.

Fact: First Responder Response Times in Hawaii Can Exceed 30 Minutes

- In Hawaii County, large portions of rural communities experience emergency response times exceeding 30 minutes.
- According to national crime data, the average police response time to an active crime nationwide is 7-10 minutes—yet in rural Hawaii, response times can be three to five times longer.

In life-threatening situations—whether from **home invasions**, **violent crimes**, **or other emergencies**—residents **cannot rely on immediate law enforcement intervention**. They must have the legal means to protect themselves, especially in rural areas where **law enforcement presence is limited**.

SB401 disproportionately impacts those who live in these vulnerable areas by stripping away lawful self-defense options while doing nothing to address the **actual** sources of criminal activity.

SB401 Will Burden Taxpayers With Unnecessary Legal Costs

This bill is **not only unconstitutional** but will also result in **costly litigation at the expense of Hawaii's taxpayers.**

Fact: Other States Have Faced Millions in Legal Costs Over Similar Bans

Several states have attempted to enact sweeping gun bans **similar to SB401**—and have faced **significant legal challenges and taxpayer-funded expenses** as a result.

- Illinois' Semiautomatic Weapons Ban: In 2024, a federal judge ruled Illinois' ban unconstitutional, leading to an estimated \$2 million in legal fees and appeals costs—a financial burden carried by taxpayers.
- California's Magazine Ban: In 2023, a federal court struck down California's ban on high-capacity magazines, after the state spent over \$3 million in legal battles defending it.
- New York's Handgun Licensing Restrictions: After *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen*, the state had to pay nearly \$5 million in litigation fees after losing in court.

If SB401 is enacted, Hawaii will likely face **similar lawsuits** challenging the ban under the **Second Amendment and recent Supreme Court rulings** (*District of Columbia v. Heller* and *Bruen*).

Estimated Costs to Hawaii Taxpayers

Based on the legal expenses incurred by **other states**, defending SB401 in court could easily **cost Hawaii taxpayers between \$2 million and \$5 million**—a **waste of public funds** that could instead be allocated to:

- Improving law enforcement resources
- Strengthening public safety initiatives
- Addressing pressing community needs

Passing **legislation that is highly likely to be overturned** is not only irresponsible **but fiscally reckless.** The state should **not** be spending millions of taxpayer dollars defending an ineffective and unconstitutional law.

Conclusion: SB401 Should Be Rejected

SB401 is deeply flawed legislation that:

- Fails to reduce crime or prevent criminals from acquiring firearms.
- Unjustly restricts law-abiding citizens while ignoring the real causes of gun violence.
- Endangers Hawaii residents by limiting their ability to defend themselves in areas with long emergency response times.
- **Exposes taxpayers to millions of dollars in legal costs** for a law that is almost certain to be overturned in court.

Rather than passing a **broad and arbitrary ban**, I urge lawmakers to focus on policies that **actually enhance public safety**—such as stronger enforcement against illegal gun trafficking, improved mental health resources, and targeted criminal justice reforms.

For these reasons, I strongly urge this committee to **reject SB401** and instead pursue measures that respect both **constitutional rights and public safety.**

The proposed prohibitions on so-called "assault rifles," "assault shotguns," and .50 caliber rifles, as well as the expansion of bans on high-capacity detachable magazines, represent a clear and unconstitutional infringement on the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding Americans. Recent Supreme Court decisions, particularly *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association, Inc. v. Bruen* (2022), reaffirm that firearm regulations must be consistent with the historical understanding of the right to keep and bear arms. This proposal fails that test.

Unconstitutionality and Second Amendment Violation

The Second Amendment guarantees that "the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." The Supreme Court's decision in *Bruen* established a clear standard for evaluating firearm regulations: any restriction must be "consistent with the Nation's historical tradition of firearm regulation." This means that unless a law is grounded in historical precedent from the time of the Founding, it is unconstitutional.

1. No Historical Basis for Banning Commonly Owned Firearms

• The firearms targeted in this proposal—semi-automatic rifles, shotguns, and .50 caliber rifles are in common use by civilians for lawful purposes, including self-defense, hunting, and sport shooting.

• *District of Columbia v. Heller* (2008) held that banning firearms in "common use" violates the Second Amendment. The *Bruen* decision reaffirmed this principle, making it clear that broad bans on commonly owned firearms are unconstitutional.

2. Unlawful Expansion of Magazine Restrictions

• High-capacity magazines are widely owned and used for self-defense, home protection, and competitive shooting.

• There is no historical tradition of restricting magazine capacity; therefore, such restrictions fail the *Bruen* test.

• Recent federal court decisions, such as *Duncan v. Bonta* (2023), have found that bans on high-capacity magazines violate the Second Amendment under *Bruen*.

Supreme Court Precedent: Bruen and Its Impact

In *Bruen*, the Supreme Court struck down New York's restrictive concealed carry law, ruling that gun regulations must be historically justified. The decision emphasized that modern firearm restrictions must align with historical traditions of gun ownership. The proposed prohibitions do not meet this requirement because:

- There is no historical tradition of banning entire categories of commonly used firearms.
- There is no precedent for restricting magazine capacities based on arbitrary limits.

• Firearm restrictions must be evaluated based on whether they respect the individual right to self-defense—a right that these bans severely infringe upon.

This proposal is a direct assault on the constitutional rights of law-abiding citizens and contradicts clear Supreme Court precedent. By banning commonly used firearms and restricting magazine capacity, it imposes unconstitutional limitations on the Second Amendment. Given the legal clarity provided by *Bruen*, any such restrictions are bound to be struck down in court. Lawmakers should focus on enforcing existing laws and addressing criminal misuse of firearms rather than infringing on the rights of responsible gun owners.

I strongly oppose this measure. This is a ridiculous ban that vilifies 50 caliber firearms which are not inherently any more dangerous than other calibers and chamberings of firearms. 50 caliber firearms are only viewed as being so dangerous because they are commonly used by the military and they are big and loud, but there are many more deadly cartridges out there that are totally legal for any civilian in the USA to own. There are more powerful cartridges with higher muzzle energy. There are cartridges that fire with more velocity. There are cartridges with more penetration. There are cartridges that are more aerodynamic and can be used to shoot longer distances.

This rule is also poorly written and would seemingly ban any firearm with a larger bore than .50 cal. Which would ban most shotguns out there which are commonly used for defense and hunting.

Barring intentional subterfuge, it can be reasonably assumed that the intent of SB401 isn't to ban shotguns, but that's not what the words in this bill mean in normal language. A shotgun is a firearm, and the most-common shotgun (12 gauge) has a "caliber" of .729". Shotguns are explicitly excluded in most other bills and laws of this sort. The nearly century-old National Firearms Act, which is the federal law on the matter, imposes additional restrictions on:

any type of weapon by whatever name known which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, the barrel or barrels of which have a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter, **except a shotgun**...

Banning almost all shotguns would be so far beyond the Overton window found anywhere in the country, or even much of the world, that I feel silly even needing to oppose it. Shotguns are extremely common for sporting, hunting and self-defense purposes. Such a ban would be met with popular outrage and enormous judicial blowback.

Due to the fatuous language in this bill, I expect the bill to be amended and so I'm also compelled to also testify on what must be the intent behind the bill. The typical points against bans on *non-shotgun* 50 caliber firearms are:

A) the targeted firearms have extremely little practical use to a common criminal,

B) (*non-shotgun*) firearms above 50 caliber are already tightly restricted by federal law, so it's extremely capricious to move the legal limit from "can't be over 50 caliber" to "must be under 50 caliber". This language seeks to play an audaciously punitive game of whack-a-mole. 50 caliber bores have been standardized on largely because they've been the legally-defined upper limit; banning 50 caliber bores would make "499 caliber" bores the upper legal limit. This would put a strain on the legal firearms community to retool to very-slightly-smaller calibers, but afterwards there'd be a legal product functionally identical to what it used to be. I'd personally be compelled to sell my 50 caliber rifle and buy a slightly smaller rifle. Would I then need to trade that in for yet another slightly smaller rifle a year later? What'd be the point of this?

Please don't advance this bill, and also please insist that legislators write better bills.

Gun magazine bans, which limit the number of rounds a firearm can hold, are often proposed as a way to reduce gun violence, particularly in mass shootings. However, there's a case to be made that they don't work as intended, and here's why.

First, the practical impact on shooters is minimal. Reloading a firearm takes seconds experienced shooters can swap magazines in under two seconds, and even novices can do it quickly with minimal practice. In a mass shooting scenario, where victims are often unarmed and chaos reigns, this brief pause doesn't meaningfully hinder the attacker or provide a window for intervention. Look at the 2012 Aurora theater shooting: the shooter used a 100-round drum magazine, which notoriously jammed, yet he still fired 76 rounds by switching to other weapons. A ban on high-capacity magazines wouldn't have stopped him—he adapted on the spot.

Second, enforcement is a nightmare. Millions of standard-capacity magazines (typically 10-30 rounds) are already in circulation, legally owned by civilians. The ATF estimated in 1994, during the federal assault weapons ban, that there were tens of millions of these magazines out there. No buyback or confiscation program could realistically collect them all, especially since many owners wouldn't comply. Criminals, who don't follow laws by definition, would keep or source them illegally anyway. The 1994-2004 federal ban saw no measurable drop in gun homicides, per studies like the 2004 DOJ report, partly because pre-ban magazines stayed widely available.

Third, the focus on magazine size ignores the bigger picture of gun violence. Most gun deaths over 60% in the U.S., according to CDC data—are suicides, where magazine capacity is irrelevant. Homicides, often tied to gang activity or domestic disputes, typically involve far fewer rounds than any magazine limit would restrict. A 2013 study from the FBI found that the average number of shots fired in criminal assaults is under 4. Mass shootings, while horrific, are statistically rare, making up less than 1% of gun deaths annually. Targeting magazines feels like a solution mismatched to the problem.

Lastly, bans spark workarounds. Shooters can carry multiple guns or magazines-Virginia Tech

(2007) saw 174 rounds fired with 10- and 15-round magazines, legally compliant at the time. 3D printing now lets anyone make high-capacity magazines at home, bypassing laws entirely. Tech's only gotten better since then.

The argument isn't that magazine bans are inherently bad policy—just that they don't deliver the promised results. They're a feel-good measure that doesn't address root causes or adapt to real-world behavior. Data and history suggest the juice isn't worth the squeeze.

I am writing to register my STRONG OPPOSITION to Bill SB401 (all forms put forth to date), the proposed legislation on the banning of all modern firearms with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher.

I oppose this bill for many reasons. To enumerate a few:

1) This bill will do nothing to prevent violent criminals from using such firearms to commit crimes anywhere in the State. Violent criminals pay no attention to laws or restrictions of any kind, and thus such a law only affects the law abiding who would not misuse firearms for criminal purposes. This, clearly, is not rational.

2) This bill attempts to ban an entire class of firearms: namely, those modern weapons with a caliber above the arbitrary value of fifty caliber. The Supreme Court has held that arms which are commonly posessed by citizens for lawful purposes **may not be banned**. There are hundreds of thousands of pistols and rifles posessing the characteristics specified in this legislation, and owned today by U.S. citizens for lawful purposes. There is nothing "magical" about the value of fifty caliber. Such weapons are not classified by existing rules as "destructive devices". Clearly, according to Supreme Court ruling, such firearms may NOT be banned.

3) The attempt to pass legislation which is itself forbidden under The Constitution and as clarified by the US Supreme Court sets a very bad example. Because it puts forth the idea that certain groups in our Nation are above the Law of the Land. This is a very dangerous slippery slope. Laws must be consistent with the Constitution, and must apply to all, equally. Otherwise they are meaningless.

So. PLEASE vote AGAINST this bill. It is not only bad policy, but it also blatantly violates the supreme law of the land, which is the Bill of Rights as enshrined in The Constitution of the United States.

The Second Amendment guarantees the right to keep and bear arms, and recent U.S. Supreme Court rulings have reaffirmed that this right extends to firearms in common use for lawful purposes. Large-caliber firearms, while less common than handguns or rifles in smaller calibers, are legally owned and used responsibly across the country. This bill risks infringing on these protected rights, inviting legal challenges that could burden the state unnecessarily. Finally, the proposal lacks a clear connection to Hawaii's specific needs. For purposes of this subsection: "Firearm or rifle with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber of higher" does not include antique pistols, antique revolvers, or muzzleloaders. 7 "Muzzleloaders" means any rifle, pistol, or shotgun that loads from the muzzle, or the open end of a weapon, from which the ammunition is discharged." SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

There is no statistical or empirical evidence that legally owned .50 caliber firearms are used in crimes in Hawaii. Criminals do not follow firearm laws—by definition, they break them. Stripping law-abiding citizens of their right to own certain firearms does nothing to stop violent crime but instead weakens the ability of responsible citizens to protect themselves and their families.

3. .50 Caliber Firearms Are Used for Sporting and Defensive Purposes

Contrary to the misleading portrayal of .50 caliber firearms, these weapons are not commonly used in crimes. Instead, they are frequently used for:

• Long-range target shooting and precision sports

- Hunting large game
- Personal collection and historical preservation

There are **no documented cases of a legally owned .50 caliber firearm being used in violent crime in Hawaii**. This bill is a **solution in search of a problem** and unfairly penalizes responsible gun owners.

4. Unenforceable and Creates a Dangerous Precedent

SB401 SD1 fails to define how the government will enforce this ban without infringing on due process and private property rights. Will the state **seize** legally purchased firearms from current owners? If so, this raises serious **Fourth and Fifth Amendment concerns** regarding unlawful searches and seizures.

Furthermore, history has shown that incremental firearm bans rarely stop at one restriction. If this bill passes, what is next? Banning all centerfire rifles? Restricting all semi-automatic handguns? The legislature must not open the door to further erosion of our constitutional rights.

5. Hawaii's Crime Issues Stem from Policy Failures, Not Lawful Gun Owners

Hawaii consistently ranks among the **most restrictive states for gun ownership**, yet crime remains a problem due to **soft-on-crime policies**, lenient sentencing, and an overwhelmed **justice system**. Instead of further restricting law-abiding citizens, lawmakers should focus on enforcing **existing gun laws**, ensuring **repeat offenders and violent criminals** remain behind bars, and addressing **mental health and societal issues** that contribute to violence.

Conclusion

SB401 SD1 is an **unjust**, **ineffective**, **and unconstitutional** restriction on responsible firearm ownership. It does nothing to reduce crime but instead **disarms law-abiding citizens while ignoring the root causes of violence**. I urge this committee to **reject SB401 SD1** and instead focus on policies that **hold criminals accountable**, **support law enforcement**, **and respect the constitutional rights of Hawaii's residents**.



Good morning, Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and Members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary. My name is Dennis Dunn, and I am the retired Director of the Victim Witness Kokua Services in the Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney's Office after 44 years of service. Prior to that I was a volunteer Victim Advocate for People Against Rape. I am testifying today **in strong support of SB 401, S.D. 1**.

Too often during my career in victim assistance I have had to console victims of gun violence or their surviving family members. We hardly need to be reminded of the immense destructive power of assault weapons as we are constantly made aware of the death and suffering cause by them in the virtual daily litany of mass casualty incidents that are caused by these weapons. There is no legitimate purpose in a civilized society for devices whose only purpose is to rapidly administer death and serious bodily injury to human beings. I am uncertain as to why our current firearms statutes fail to outlaw to encompass assault rifles and shotguns, but the time to change that is now. Given the increases in gun crimes, even in Hawai'i, this is a critical legislative need. Our statutory defense against assault weapons must be airtight with no loopholes. The stakes in the battle against gun violence are high and every resource in preventing assault weapons anywhere in Hawai'i.
