A Bill for an Act Relating to a Constitutional Convention. Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Hawaii: SECTION 1. **Purpose.** Article XV, section 2, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii provides that the legislature may submit to the electorate at any general or special election the question, "Shall there be a convention to propose a revision of or amendments to the constitution?" It is the purpose of this Act to provide for the submission of such question at the general election of 1966 in conformity with the March 9, 1965 minute order of the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii in Civil No. 2308.

SECTION 2. Submission of question. The legislature hereby submits the question, "Shall there be a convention to propose a revision of or amendments to the constitution?" to the electorate, which question shall be voted on at the general election of 1966.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. (Became law July 26, 1965, without Governor's signature pursuant to Art. III, § 17, Const.) H.B. 986.
