S.B. NO. 3227

A Bill for an Act Relating to Fishing.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. Section 188-40, Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

“**§188-40 Minimum sizes of fish.** It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, or offer for sale, or for any peddler or dealer in fish to have in the peddler’s or dealer’s possession, any (1) aholehole or manini less than five inches in length, or (2) mullet, moi, weke, moana, or kumu less than seven inches in length, or (3) awa, oio, kala, or opelu kala less than nine inches in length, or (4) opakapaka, ulaula, uku, ulua or papio, uhu [slipper lobster,] or squid less than one pound in weight, or (5) [kauhonu] kuahonu crab or Kona crab less than four inches in length or in width across or along its back, or (6) clams less than one and one-half inches measured the long way.”

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
