HB 1 Relating to Transportation

As you are considering your contributions on the Superferry draft bill debate, I would like to provide you with my thoughts. My request, supported below, is that the Superferry be allowed to conduct service to outer islands while an EIS is being conducted, and without restrictions that would impact such service.

1. Most of the strong opinions being voiced on Kauai have been by those opposed only. This does not mean that Kauai is mostly against the superferry. It only means that those against it are loud. Many who are for it are the quiet type that are not likely to be loud in their support by writing letters to the editor, gathering with signs, etc. Many are also afraid of what can be characterized as an angry mob. I was at the public forum on Kauai in which the governor and others came to talk and Ito listen. I was honestly concerned that a riot would ensue. From what I've seen of the Kauai polls (do not know, however, their scientific validity), there is not a strong consensus either way. And, there is an overwhelming consensus on Oahu for the Superferry.

2. Consider what message this sends to the world as to Hawaii's receptiveness to business. I work in the high technology sector, and in my recent business activities, I've seen negative evidence of outside investors willingness to do business in Hawaii. For instance, I had a recent meeting with a local high tech startup company (my company was looking for promising companies to team with) in which the President of that company has been seeking funds from venture capitalists. This person has been unable to capture investment from any mainland venture capitalists. Several had gone so far to tell this company's president that if the company moved to the mainland they would invest because they saw significant promise in the product, but they saw it as too much of a risk to invest in a Hawaii-based company. The Superferry story has been all over worldwide news, and the recent court rulings as to Go Airlines had also been cited as contributors toward the risk assessment.

3. Whether or not the Superferry stays or goes, we as taxpayers (federal and state) will be paying for it. What a waste of our money if the Superferry leaves and we pay for something we don't even receive the benefit for. Too often we forget that this is our hard-earned money being squandered, not monopoly money.

4. Think about what the real issues are. Wade through the hidden agendas. I believe the root of this issue has less to do with impacts on the environment and more to do with the outer islands seeking to keep Oahu's ills on Oahu. Do we have a right to exclude? Even if we all agree that it is a good thing to keep Kauai pristine and rural, do we have the right to exclude?

5. I challenge you to name to me one instance in which an EIS really accomplished its goal, and at a reasonable expense. Again, remember you will be spending our hard-earned money, not monopoly money. My high tech line of work is related to the department of defense. In this work, I have been exposed to many environmental assessment and impact statement processes. My experience has found them to be very wasteful (time and money) endeavors and the results have typically been so watered down that any useful output was dubious at best. Much of the reason for this in my mind is that the impacts are often somewhat speculative, therefore no hard conclusions can be drawn. Even if you disagree with my economic thread through this email, please think whether an EIS will actually accomplish anything tangible, other than making everyone in the process feel good because we followed a process. How will you measure whether whales are killed or not?

It is time for local residents to have a viable alternative to inter-island flights in order to visit family living on the outer islands. Not everyone likes to fly. Just because cars are allowed on the ferry, this doesn't mean everyone would be taking theirs. Family members would frequently be picking up passengers. Tourists are welcomed to the islands with open arms as long as they fly over and rent cars. How is this any different from arriving on a ship??? And the reverse is true for outer island residents who come to Oahu.

It seems to us that those most opposed to the SuperFerry are likely backed by industry such as Young Brothers, Hawaiian and Aloha Airlines and the rental car companies. These are the ones most threatened by the SuperFerry. We have not seen an EIS for the latest water activity in Oahu waters -the Screamer -- which is much more likely to be a hazard to our whales than the SuperFerry. But, no one is crying foul on that one. Why? Because it doesn't threaten Young Brothers, etc., who just purchased a brand new car barge.

And we have all noticed that the most vocal protestors (and the only people shown by the media) are not Hawaiians concerned about their islands, but rather those who have nothing better to do than voice opposition to a company that has bent over backwards to satisfy the law in starting their business. Te SuperFerry provides over 300 jobs to local people on all the islands, not just Oahu.

It's time to allow the Ferry to commence operations, while following the rules and regulations intended to protect our environment. Obviously, no one wants harm to come to the whales and the islands, but the Ferry is not the evil force the protestors are making it out to be.

To those who say all the criminals and drug dealers will invade their islands from Oahu, I would remind you, they can just as easily fly over or use fishing boats, and there are more drug dealers on the outer islands than on Oahu.

Reason must prevail in this very serious matter.

Unfortunately, I have a business commitment that will prevent my attendance at Thursday's hearing. However, I want to have my opinion placed upon the record.

I believe the time is long overdue for Hawaii to have inter island ferry service....again! Let us not forget that for many hundreds of years the only way to travel inter island was by canoe, sailboat and, finally, steamboat. Today, only those lucky enough to have a private sailboat or powerboat capable of channel crossings, or those wealthy enough to afford a week long cruise are able to travel interisland via water.

My reasons for supporting the Superferry are multi faceted. First of all, as a small business owner who has had projects on all of the islands, the option of traveling with my vehicle is a tremendous improvement. Currently I have to ship via barge, fly interisland and rent a vehicle. All of those extra charges are, of course, passed onto my inter island customers. HB 1 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION
