Dear Chairs Souki and Oshiro:

My name is Patrick Adamek and I strongly support Hawaii Superferry.

I believe that the Hawaii Superferry is important and necessary to support competive pricing in the transportation industry as well as the service industry. Currently the only means of transportation between our counties (Islands) is by aircraft. Transportation by aircraft restricts the service industry from building, repairing, maintaining, and/or installations by organizations other than what exists on the Island where one resides. Aircraft travel restricts the amount of weight associated with the equipment and tools necessary to pursue such projects on neighboring Islands and, as a result, curbs the competitive nature and spirit of the service industry. If, for example, I have a crew equiped and ready to do a repair or construction job for me from Oahu here on the Big Island but cannot do it because there is no means to transport their equipment I must do business with whomever I can here within the Big Island. This results in a monopoly of certain service organizations and therefore these organizations can price accordingly as a result of having no other competition. In addition, airlines know that there is no other means for transportation and although currently there is a price war of sorts within that industry that "war" will eventually cease and the residents of Hawaii will suffer as a result. If in doubt about the support for the Hawaii Superferry I urge you to put the vote to the residents of our great State in the form of a referendum to determine how the majority really feels about this matter.
