Requiring businesses to complete operational plans before serving a single customer is fine, but totally different from restraining one which had already opened their doors and was up-and-running. The court stoppage was much too late for the ferry to make necessary corrections without suffering a loss in multimillions of dollars. That final ruling from our courts should have been issued well over a year ago, not a few days before the Superferry sailed.

An EIS takes time - anyone realizes this --- our courts did not!

Restraining orders against individuals or businesses come about only <u>after</u> something happens, not before. For Superferry, **nothing** has happened that requires a court-ordered stoppage, only **if** something happens.

Whatever happened to "innocent until proven guilty?" The Hawaii Superferry has been convicted and punished even before it harms a single whale, transports one invasive creature, desecrates any cultural area. This seems like what a "third-world" country, *or perhaps* Hawaii, would do.

The legislature must fix this problem in Special Session. That is your duty to all of the people in this state.

Aloha,

I support the Hawaii Superferry because it has raised the bar in inter-island travel for passengers and vehicles. In short, there is a preponderance of ignorance driving the emotional outcries we keep hearing in opposition. Please raise the bar and approach this situation with facts, logic and common sense.

In considering my support, you may refer to the following reasons:

1. From what I can determine, it is the most environmentally designed ship that sails in Hawaiian waters.

a. It is a zero eject ship, discharging NOTHING into the ocean. (If you've ever been to sea and observed the "standards" in reality of most ocean-going vessels, you would be amazed at their lack of environmental concern in terms of actual practice.)

i. Since it is a NO SMOKING vessel, not even cigarette butts go into the ocean. It may be the only ship on the Hawaiian seas to accomplish that. "Cigarette butts are the most common form of plastic litter on the beaches of the U.S. and world-wide. Toxic chemicals can leach out of the cigarette filters." (http://www.longwood.edu/cleanva/ciglitterarticle.htm)

b. Its hulls are treated with a special coating of non-toxic silicone so as not to accumulate detritus that could be transported between island environments.

2. The Hawaii Superferry (unlike other ocean transporters or inter-island air carriers) practices the following to restrict the transport of invasive species:

a. Most thorough screening of cars to be transported.

b. Conducts agricultural screening of every inter-island passenger.

c. Opens vehicles' and looks into the wheel wells and under the bumpers and other compartments.

d. Rejects muddy vehicles.

3. The Hawaii Superferry is conscious and aware of the potential impact of vehicular traffic embarking and disembarking from the ferry. They have:

a. Implemented a vehicle and management plan based on traffic studies

b. Revised arrival and departure schedules to avoid the busiest traffic times to minimize impacts.

c. Allows for early arrival, lessening short-term traffic impact.

4. For residents pointing to the vehicular traffic increase on their respective islands, they need to get the facts before they make an issue of it:

a. What has the percentage increase in vehicular traffic since Go! Airlines came to the islands bringing an airfare war, creating a marked increase in inter-island travel? That needs to be factored in.

b. In addition, the number of vehicles traveling on the ferry, embarking and disembarking, will include residents of the respective islands – the vehicles will not just be "interlopers". The number of vehicles daily impacting each island is a combination of outer island travelers and Oahu travelers. The outer islands are not being "invaded" by vehicles from Oahu. Vehicles will be traveling FROM the outer islands to Oahu also. It is not just a one-way path from Oahu to the outer islands.

c. The ferry will also be carrying vehicles a number of the vehicles traveling will be for the transport of goods and services. These incoming vehicles potentially will be offset by less vehicular delivery traffic carrying goods from other ocean-going vessels or freight carried by the airlines offloaded to trucks for delivery.

5. The Hawaii Superferry is a service for local people – to travel personally, and for their business use. The company also employs local people and if the ferry sails, and grows as its business plan projects, many jobs will be provided. Additionally, the ferry provides cost-effective transport for inter-island businesses and their products.

6. Finally, this business needs to be acknowledged as the environmental bar to which all existing transport businesses should be held. If people are really concerned about their environment, restrictions need to be imposed on the airlines and all ocean-going vessels, transporting passengers, goods and vehicles:

a. Are those cars transported clean and inspected?

b. Are the crew and passengers on the other forms of transportation questioned as to their potential detrimental impact on our environment?

i. Have they been hiking, where they might have picked up invasive species?

- ii. Have they been fishing and cleaned their gear?
- iii. Have their backpacks been inspected?

My wife and I come to Hawaii frequently and we have visited the major islands many times. It has always astounded us that there is no Inter-Island Ferry system. If there were, we would stay longer and take side trips with our car. As it is, we need to fly between islands, rent a different car, and it just costs too much.

Now, lets compare the situation with the US Virgin Islands and the British Virgin Islands. There, we can make many trips on high speed Ferries at a very low cost. So, we usually start in Charlotte Amalie and hop from island to island (both USVI and BVI). Why not do it here in Hawaii?

The system in the Virgin Islands makes so much sense that we think Hawaii's motto should be "no, you can't." And the reason is the Environmentalists who feel they should be in charge of public policy. Now, I ask you, "who elected them to tell us what to do?" These organizations are operating like rogue elephants, waging terrorist campaigns and endangering lives, even children's lives, over the SuperFerry issue. And, for waging these campaigns, they enjoy taxexemptions, even though political activities are not in the charter of tax-exempt organizations. Now, who is in charge here?

Aloha. My name is Tracey Schavone. Mahalo to everyone present for taking the time to come to this briefing on a Sunday afternoon to hear to our concerns regarding the Hawaii Superferry.

I would like to begin by stating that I am in opposition to holding a Special Session for the express purpose of allowing the Superferry to operate prior to an environmental assessment or an EIS. In reading this proposed bill I saw that it states "The purpose of this Act is also to amend all relevant existing laws"....the definition of amend is "to change for the better"...so in reality this document would be more accurate by stating "this Act is meant to circumvent all relevant existing laws." The definition of circumvent being "to go around or bypass".

I also saw included in this bill the following:

"By encouraging the growing of products on the islands of Kauai, Maui & Hawaii for the Oahu market, the operations of a large capacity ferry vessel company would foster diversified agriculture, helping the state of Hawaii to meet one of its constitutional mandates."

The Superferry fare for a commercial truck is currently \$860.00 for a full load and \$528.00 for an empty truck. This price does not include the passenger fares, which are \$52.00 or \$62.00 each way per person, depending on the day of the week. Not exactly a great deal for the farmers.

It is undeniable that the two most important things to sustain life are clean water and nourishing food.

If in fact the government wishes to foster diversified agriculture a Superferry is not the answer. Perhaps you could pass laws that actually protect our agricultural lands from becoming gentleman estates. Perhaps you could pass laws protecting the water rights of the farmers who are currently doing their best to provide diversified agriculture on our island right now, such as those experiencing hardships since the KaLoko Dam tragedy. Perhaps you could pass laws which would allow farmers to live on their land and allow them to provide housing for those who wish to assist them in their agricultural endeavors Perhaps you could pass laws that would insure that our agricultural lands are being utilized to grow food which will sustain us rather than genetically modified corn seed that is not fit to eat and which may very likely be creating contamination of our soils, air and waters.

And in regards to an oversight task force to study the State's actions...who are we kidding here...this is absolutely ludicrous.

I am testifying in opposition of the proposed Superferry Bill for the following reasons. Upon reviewing the proposed bill, I have noted in Section 4, pg. 13 beginning on line 15, an amendment is required regarding Dept. of Ag and DOCARE presonnel. Suggested wording is in bold.

15)..."The governor shall also consider establishing conditions and protocols such as allowing department of agriculture inspectors and department of land and natural resources conservation and resources enforcement personnel to search any vehicle, baggage, container or carry-on item, without probable cause while said items are within parking lots, staging areas, docks, cargo hold, cabin or any area belonging to or pertaining to a large capacity ferry vessel company, as the department head of each county deems necessary and appropriate."....

Searches will enhance the accuracy of the E.A. and E.I.S. as it will help determine exactly how much impact the ferry is having with factual documentation. Random searches will also deter resource abuse.

Furthermore, to mitigate the affects of the superferry, additional staffing is required for both departments. DOCARE required additional staffing are **three CREO III**, and one **CREO IV officer positions as well as two Clerk Typist III administrative staff.** Dept. of Ag requires **four Plant Quarantine Inspectors** and **four Plant Pest Control Technicians**. As well as funding for equipment, ie vehicles. These positions fall under the Division of Plant Industry. All positions for both Dept. are for Maui only. Positions are solely for the mitigation of the increased responsibility incurred by the Departments.

Dear Senate Sergeant at Arms,

My husband, William Wakefield, and I are both Kamaaina, our families having arrived in Hawaii in the late 1800's. We have fished and farmed on the Big Island for decades. We love our state with all our hearts, and are vehemently opposed to the Superferry conducting business anywhere in Hawaii.

There are many reasons that we do not want this company here. One reason is that they do not show the respect for many of our peoples, especially the outer islanders. We have asked for the environmental study, and they have said no. This is reason enough for us to feel that they are doing this just for the money and not to better our community, and we don't want them here with that attitude.

Another reason, just as important, is the harm to our environment that they probably would cause. The spread of invasive and alien species would be hastened. I am particularly worried about the spread of the bee mite which has devastated some agricultural commodities in California, and now has been found on Oahu. If this mite is transferred to Kona, through hitchhiking bees on the ferry, our Kona Coffee yields would go down. It is hard enough for many of our farmers to make a living, but to battle a greater influx of pests would change our agricultural community and way of life. Once that mite or another pest is here, we will not be able go back and change our minds about this ferry. (California has to import bee hives from other states to pollinate their crops. We would not have this luxury.)

We also feel the untracked transportation of stolen goods and drugs would occur much more rapidly and easier with this ferry service, adding more costs to our police department.

We realize that many people, especially from Oahu, can only see the benefits of having this form of transportation, but we think that they have not been given all of the facts. With the environmental study, people would have more of the facts and would therefore be able to make better informed decisions. Please keep the welfare of our rural communities and environment in your hearts and make the decision to follow the laws that were put into place to protect us. Thank you!

The SuperFerry will add immeasurably to the pleasure of living in Hawaii. Those, like me, who have been here for generations, have family all over the islands. What a pleasure it will be to board a ferry, see the ocean of the islands, and take our own car with us when we visit them — or just visit another island to see another part of this state of rare beauty.

Certainly the environment is very important. But people are much more important. Cars kill, maim and have an unquestionably deleterious effect on the environment, but who among us would give them up? The advantages to us as human beings far outweigh their disadvantages.

Compared to automobiles, the SuperFerry's effect on the environment will be much, much less, and wise environmental steps can easily be put in place to minimize any damage to our environment.

The SuperFerry should be allowed to run commercially between the islands right away, and any protestors violating the law should be legally dealt with, including suitable fines, inconvenience to them, and jail time if necessary. My friends and I plan to use the Superferry for interisland transportation. I realize the importance of ensuring sound environmental and ecological protection during ferry operations.

There are environmental and ecological positives to consider with the Superferry. Will interisland ferry travel reduce interisland air travel and the air pollution associated with the latter? Further, my motorcycle which would be used for my ferry travel, is more fuel efficient than the rental car I would use when I fly to neighboring islands. Everyday that an individual uses his own vehicle (as opposed to buying a new one or renting one) is one less day that another vehicle is needed on the Hawaiian islands. While these days may not seem significant when considered individually, the numbers do become significant when compiled for the population. The indirect effect is a reduced number of vehicles (for rental or private ownership) shipped to this island. That means reduced fueled expended in the shipping and less energy expended in disposal of the more numerous vehicles.

I am writing to urge support for the Hawaii Superferry. I think this will help improve interisland medical care, communication, and commerce. I take care of many patients from neighbor islands, who currently have to fly to Honolulu for care. The Superferry would provide another option for these people during times of need to be able to bring their cars and their families if they are anticipating long stays. In addition, in times of emergency, the Superferry can be used to transport needed supplies and medical equipment between islands if air service is shut down, as happened after 9/11.

I personally would also like the option to take my family camping or kayaking on the neighbor islands. Currently our kayak club uses Manson freight to transport kayaks before anticipated trips, so this is already taking place. Superferry would just make it more convenient, pleasant, and less expensive.
