 You represent the State of Hawaii, which through numerous polls has shown that residents are overwhelmingly in favor of the SuperFerry being allowed to operate. This is what the public wants and needs.
You represent the State of Hawaii, which gave assurances to the company, and the community, that this company could in good faith set up business here in Hawaii, and invest millions of dollars in the process.
Precedents were set with other carriers for such assurances to be extended in good faith. The State Government (Judiciary) at this point seems to be acting in an arbitrary, if not political manner. The legislature can at this point restore some measure of public faith and trust in the government process by restoring balance of power and equity to the situation.

4. Because of the precedents set by other carriers, and the supposedly negligible impact on the environment, there seems to be little justification in withholding permission for a temporary permit to operate, especially given the safeguards that are being included.

I urge you to permit the SuperFerry to sail, to salvage some of our reputation as a place to do business, to take away some of the third-world stigma this brings upon all of us, and to restore some measure of faith that our government is indeed for the people, by the people.

- 1. EIS were not required of Madsen or any of the cruise lines.
- 2. If the EIS were required at the very beginning the project would probably never have been started this is why the EIS requirement was waived.
- 3. The Superferry management and owners shouldn't be punished because the EIS requirement was waived.

As Hawai'i residents, my wife & I offer our enthusiastic testimony in strong favor of allowing the Hawai'i Superferry to begin immediate operations pending completion of the EIS.

We were excited to be taking our Harley Davidson motorcycle to Maui last month on the Hawai'i Superferry. An inter-island vehicle ferry is an idea we had dreamed about for many years. I first thought of the idea when Seaflight came to Hawai'i in the 1970's. It was unfortunate that they did not offer land vehicle transport. More on them later....

For our Maui trip on the superferry, we had booked a condo on the beach in Ka'ana'pali. We planned to shop in Lahaina, attend a luau, do some diving & ride our bike all over the island. We had to cancel all of that, & have lost room deposit money as a result. Many business' in Maui lost even more, as we never spent any money there.

We had purchased actually two sets of tickets. We originally booked at full fare, & then booked a second date at the reduced 5 dollar fare. Many of our friends were also planning to avail of this exciting new service, which would for the first time, connect all of Hawai'i's counties to personal land vehicles.

Many Kama'ainas are tired of the inconvenience of flying inter-island, & then having to rent a car. Many will just stay home like we did. No superferry = no trip!

We were shocked, but hardly surprised, when all the resistance ensued as the long-awaited ferry service began. Hawai'i has a tragic history of allowing special interest groups to impose their own twisted view of the world upon the rest of this. This has happened with our own business ambitions.

It is well-known that Hawai'i has an unfriendly business climate. Many foreign & mainland business' that would like to open shop in Hawai'i will not do so. They know that it is often not cost effective, & that there are many seen & unforeseen roadblocks that can spring up here in Hawai'i.

Come now the Hawai'i Superferry; a long-overdue addition to our limited inter-island transportation choices. Back in the 1970's, Seaflight offered waterborne transportation between

islands, but could not accommodate land vehicles. I recall that they had at least half a dozen highspeed hydrofoil-type boats traveling between the islands. I do not recall all of this resistance when Seaflight came to the islands.

The demise of Seaflight came because of their undersized hydrofoil boats always breaking down due to Hawai'i's high seas. I wonder why their EIS did not predict that? Could it be because they didn't do one?

We urge this committee not to allow a tiny minority of naysayers to impose their will on the vast majority of Hawai'i residents that support the superferry, & want to see it succeed. The naysayers have to understand that in a democracy, the majority rules, & the minority needs to sit down & shut up!

While many claims of the dangers posed by the Superferry on our ocean wildlife as well as the spread of invasive species are possible, it is more likely to occur with the unregulated and unsupervised operations of the various whale tours, fishing trawlers, and cruise ships. The Superferry has already taken many preventative steps in their Standard Operating Procedures to avoid harming the ocean wildlife and curtailing the spread of invasive species.

The Superferry has so many more positive aspects than negative that it is hard to understand the reluctance of the protesters on the islands of Maui and Kaua'i. It would greatly enhance our tourist attraction by making an affordable "minicruise" to the outer islands available for those unable to take a regular cruise. The economic gains for each island will increase with the constant movement of Superferry visitors by allowing them to visit and move through the islands instead of being "landed" on one island.

Maui has begun televising its Maui Minute commercials trying to attract visitors to events taking place on their island. How hypocritical is it to then be so unwelcoming to visitors coming via the Superferry? How much better could it be to welcome visitors using the Superferry for these events who leave to go home to the other islands without taking up extra airplane seats and cars so that regular visitors to the island are still able to get there and rent cars?

Kaua'i was devastated by Hurricane Iniki and has not fully recovered from its destruction yet. It is so sad to see the Coco Palms sit vacant. Kaui'i could use the Superferry to help boost its economy with visitors traveling though that beautiful island. It could stimulate the economy enough to rebuild the many businesses and hotels hurt by Iniki. When another hurricane strikes and the Superferry is gone, will these same protesters then ask the state why there is no help coming to them?

More importantly, it would be a boon to the state at a time when emergency response is needed. Thank you for allowing the opportunity to submit written testimony regarding legislation which would permit operation of the Hawaii Superferry while environmental issues are addressed. My wife and I own two properties on the Big Island. We urge the Hawaii State Legislature to identify a solution that would enable Hawaii Superferry to continue operation while an environmental assessment is being conducted. Frankly we are perplexed that, after the Superferry commenced operation and after tens of millions of dollars in state and private funds have been expended, questions about environmental compatibility are still at issue.

The nature and motivation of the Hawaii state courts' recent actions effectively rendering the Superferry dead in the water are questionable at best considering the seemingly disparate requirements imposed on other inter-island transporters. The 11th hour timing of these decisions makes them even more suspect given that years have passed by since the announcement of the development of the Superferry. These decisions do little to counter the notion that Hawaii is a provincial place when it comes to doing business.

The people of Hawaii, including those of us who consider Hawaii our second home, want inter-island transportation choices. Hawaii Superferry is a transportation alternative which will bring benefits to full and part time residents and to the businesses of Hawaii. Please don't let this alternative be cast away.

Dear Legislators,

We are residents of Hawaii Kai, and also world travelers, and have been shocked at the reasons which have been trotted out in an attempt to stop the Superferry.

The arguments that opponents only seek to delay, not stop, are specious, because the overhead expenses of keeping the Superferry and its crew idle, or underemployed, are so heavy that the company either goes bankrupt or sells the ferry to other island nations who are eagerly waiting for more high-speed ships like this.

The environmental arguments about protecting the whales have us shaking our heads incredulously. They want to protect migrating whales, they say.

Where do the whales migrate to? Alaska. So last June we were in Alaska riding the state-operated high-speed ferry through whale waters, zipping along at 40 mph, and no-one was shouting "slow down". Instead, the Park Service naturalist on board was inviting passengers to spot the whales and dolphins. We did, we saw a whale.

The Alaska state high-speed ferry operates on the same schedule year-round. If the captain feels there is a potential problem with marine life, he or she will sensibly slow down. They don't have Sierra Club monitors telling the captain how fast he or she may go.

Please do the right thing for Hawaii and let this ship operate without any conditions or restrictions, and rely on the crews' common sense. That's what Alaska does at the other end of the whales' migrating path.

Subject: Hawaii Super Ferry

The Canary Islands like the Hawaii Islands consist of 7 islands in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean. These are volcanic islands like ours with similar population, flora and fauna. The main industries are tourism and agriculture. They are part of Spain.

Fred Olsen Line (A Norwegian Company) has been providing car/passenger ferry service between these islands since 1989 with a fleet of 5 fast ferries of the same design as our Super Ferry. Their largest ferry travels at 42 knots [6 knots faster than our ferry] and carries 1250 passengers and 400 autos. This fleet provides safe dependable scheduled service among the islands and is vital to the commerce of the local population together with the tourists and especially the agricultural community.

They have never hit a whale or harmed any marine life in their history and invasive species has never been a problem. The major invasive species issue comes from the cruise/cargo vessels and air planes arriving from foreign destinations.

I am amazed that our entire community does not embrace the super ferry as a welcome addition to our inter island travel. The PUC after extensive hearings awarded the super ferry permission to operate between the islands. The Department of Transportation did all the studies and invested over 40 million dollars in harbor upgrades to ensure there would be no harm to the environment and to avoid traffic problems.

The super ferry will take us out of the dark ages and into the 21st century and finally provide us with transportation service between the islands at least comparable to those in Europe, Asia, and even the third world countries in Africa and Latin America.
