## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO GIVE PRIORITY TO CHILDREN IN POVERTY.

WHEREAS, growing up in an impoverished environment leaves 1 2 keiki vulnerable to negative life experiences such as dropping out of school, illegal substance abuse, early parenthood, 3 4 juvenile or adult delinguency, and the like; and 5 WHEREAS, the number of students qualifying for free or 6 reduced cost school meals is a reliable indicator of poverty in 7 8 our state, and as of October 2012, there were 180,482 students 9 enrolled under the Hawaii Child Nutrition Program with 74,176 10 receiving free lunches/breakfasts; 19,816 receiving reduced cost lunches/breakfast; and 86,490 paying full price; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, to qualify for the Hawaii Child Nutrition Program 14 the U.S. Department of Education eligibility guidelines for possible recipients are 130 percent of the Hawaii federal 15 poverty limit for free meals and 185 percent for reduced meals; 16 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, for a family of four the eligibility guidelines in 20 dollars is \$35,217 for free meals and \$50,117 for reduced-price 21 meals; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the above example is but one of a variety of examples illustrating the struggles of Hawaii's keiki in today's 24 25 society; and 26 27 WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon state leaders and government officials to focus their collective energy on helping children 28 29 and their families rise above poverty; now, therefore, 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 32 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Second 33 Special Session of 2013, that this body urges the Governor of

1 the State of Hawaii to give priority to initiatives focused on 2 improving the lives of children in poverty by dedicating more 3 State resources toward improving the economic well-being, 4 educational opportunities, health support, and family and 5 community initiatives available to Hawaii's keiki and their 6 families; and 7

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; the Chairperson of 10 the Senate Committee on Human Services; and the Chairperson of 11 the House Committee on Human Services.
