As a photographer who offers my services to the public, I will be subject to a lawsuit if I refuse to photograph a gay wedding.

All photographers specialize in and are best at different kinds of jobs. Some photographers do not do baby portraits. Some do not do architectural work. No one tells them that they must do this work if they do not want to, like to or do not feel qualified to do it. Certainly, no one is subject to a lawsuit if they pass on a job. This will not be the case for gay weddings.

I believe it would be unethical for me to take a job that I did not want to do or feel qualified to do. I do not know how to romantically pose subjects of the same sex.

Artistic work is not like selling groceries or used cars. It is not discrimination for an artist to choose the subject and medium that inspires them. I am not anti-gay or homophobic. However, I am not inspired by same sex couples. For me to take the commission of doing a gay wedding would be unethical and an injustice to the gay couple. The gay couple deserve to have someone who wants to, likes to and feels qualified to capture the most important day of their lives. I would not be able to provide that service adequately in the same way that a photographer who does not do baby pictures would be short-changing the baby's parents. He is not anti-baby or pedophobic.

I, however, would be subject to a lawsuit. This is wrong. It is not a service to gay couples. I strongly urge a no vote on the bill.





While a marriage is most certainly a spiritual act for most people, it is not necessarily a religious one. There is no one religion that can own marriage and the stability it brings. It is a civil act with benefits granted by the state and federal government. To withhold some rights for any sort of religious reason is wrong.

In a professional manner I have worked with the disparity that couples face when they are not allowed to marry. I am a Financial Advisor. I have special training for Domestic Partner Planning. I work with many couples who have been together for many years and decades. Because they do not receive the same inheritance rights that married couples have, they must pay extra money to protect themselves through additional life insurance policies to pay the taxes on the retirement accounts that they inherit. Married couples can transfer a 401k or IRA to a spouse upon death with no tax hit. Non married couples would be taxed. This is the founding of the DOMA case that the Supreme Court faced. This places an additional burden on couples living in a state that does not allow same sex marriage, simply to protect their families and protect the wealth that they have worked their entire lives to accumulate.

I am opposed to SB1, the redefining of marriage. I feel that it is important for you to know how I feel about this as part of your decision making process. It is my opinion that the issue of Same Sex Marriage should be voted on by the public just as it was back in 1998 when the majority of citizens in the State of Hawaii voted to approve a constitutional amendment against same sex marriages. The people did not understand the deceptive motive in the amendment that strips them of their power by giving the legislature absolute power over marriage.

As a Christian, I feel my beliefs will be infringed upon and one day my rights will be as well. Using history as my evidence, every empire that legalized same sex marriage resulted in an homosexual empire that persecuted Christians (pagan territories, Greeks and Romans). My name is Lianne Thompson and I would like to ask you to vote in favor of marriage rights for same-sex couples.

I am a Christian, have been since I chose to follow Jesus Christ and was subsequently baptized at age 16. I am now in my 40s. I was taught that Jesus wants us to love and respect one another. I was never taught to force my views on others who don't believe. Instead, I was told to love others and live by example.

It is because I am a Christian that I strongly believe in the separation of Church and State. I want to worship as I choose, and I am happy to let others follow their faith (or not) as they choose. Religious freedom works both ways. The government cannot impose a religion people, and the Church cannot impose its beliefs on the public (via government). I don't believe that there is any non-religious reason to deny same-sex couples the right to a legal marriage. Conversely, I will argue with anyone that churches have the right to deny same-sex couples the right to marry in their sanctuaries.

And, for the Catholic Church to say "t's okay to discriminate," is appalling to me. Do they forget a time in Hawai'i's not-so-distant history when their church was the subject of discrimination? Other Christian religions were acceptable, but not Catholics. Again, a separation of Church and State protects us all.

Allowing same-sex marriage should not, and I feel would not, lead to homosexuality being taught in the classroom. I didn't learn about any type of marriage in my public school experience. I did, however, learn about Creationism in the classroom.

The fact is, we do NOT value biblical marriage as a rule in this country and society. If we did, there would be no divorce. Divorced women would not be allowed to marry. Adultery would be illegal. If we truly considered the legal marriage that takes place a biblical entity, it would be so much more difficult to get married or divorced. We wouldn't have drive-through wedding chapels and game shows that make a marriage something to be "won." It's more difficult to get a driver's license than it is to get a marriage license. No, we do not value the sanctity of marriage in our legal marriage system. I for one, felt that I was "married" after I said my vows before my pastor. The signing of the "legal" papers was an afterthought.

However, those papers mean everything to people who do not enjoy the rights (and responsibilities!) that come with those papers. I am flabbergasted that we live in a country that feels it's okay for prisoners to get married (the one I always talk about—although he passed away earlier this year—is Richard Ramirez, the "Night Stalker." We live in a country where it's okay for a man, who was evil personified, who *preyed on women*, to marry.) yet tax-paying, law-abiding, contributing members of society, who happen to be gay, are denied this same right.

I have quite a few gay friends, some are in relationships and some aren't. Same like my straight friends. The difference is that if my single straight friends found love today, the idea of that love being justified in the eyes of the law is there for them. But not my gay friends. That seems unfair to me.

Look, when I got married, my marriage was technically illegal in Alabama (albeit, the law was not enforced), because I am asian and my husband is white. That was in the late 90s. Unbelievable, right? I implore you to please vote on the right side of history. Please do protect the religious freedoms of the various faiths who do not want to accept same-sex marriage within their sanctuaries, that is important. However, please, please let our fellow human beings, who just happen to be gay, share their love and their responsibility as couples and families with dignity and respect.





Thank you Chair Rhodes and fellow representatives for reading my testimony.

I am opposed to SB1, the redefining of marriage. I feel that it is important for you to know how I feel about this as part of your decision making process. It is my opinion that the issue of Same Sex Marriage should be voted on by the public just as it was back in 1998 when the majority of citizens in the State of Hawaii voted to approve a constitutional amendment against same sex marriages. The people did not understand the deceptive motive in the amendment that strips them of their power by giving the legislature absolute power over marriage.

As a Christian, I feel my beliefs will be infringed upon and one day my rights will be as well. Using history as my evidence, every empire that legalized same sex marriage resulted in an homosexual empire that persecuted Christians (pagan territories, Greeks and Romans). Emperor Maximus who worshipped a homosexual god Jupiter wanted the expulsion of all Christians. Antiochus brutally executed those who wouldn't worship their homosexual god. My name is Lianne Thompson and I would like to ask you to vote in favor of marriage rights for same-sex couples.

I am a Christian, have been since I chose to follow Jesus Christ and was subsequently baptized at age 16. I am now in my 40s. I was taught that Jesus wants us to love and respect one another. I was never taught to force my views on others who don't believe. Instead, I was told to love others and live by example.

It is because I am a Christian that I strongly believe in the separation of Church and State. I want to worship as I choose, and I am happy to let others follow their faith (or not) as they choose. Religious freedom works both ways. The government cannot impose a religion people, and the Church cannot impose its beliefs on the public (via government). I don't believe that there is any non-religious reason to deny same-sex couples the right to a legal marriage. Conversely, I will argue with anyone that churches have the right to deny same-sex couples the right to marry in their sanctuaries.

And, for the Catholic Church to say "t's okay to discriminate," is appalling to me. Do they forget a time in Hawai'i's not-so-distant history when their church was the subject of discrimination? Other Christian religions were acceptable, but not Catholics. Again, a separation of Church and State protects us all.

Allowing same-sex marriage should not, and I feel would not, lead to homosexuality being taught in the classroom. I didn't learn about any type of marriage in my public school experience. I did, however, learn about Creationism in the classroom.

The fact is, we do NOT value biblical marriage as a rule in this country and society. If we did, there would be no divorce. Divorced women would not be allowed to marry. Adultery would be illegal. If we truly considered the legal marriage that takes place a biblical entity, it would be so much more difficult to get married or divorced. We wouldn't have drive-through wedding chapels and game shows that make a marriage something to be "won." It's more difficult to get a driver's license than it is to get a marriage license. No, we do not value the sanctity of marriage in our legal marriage system. I for one, felt that I was "married" after I said my vows before my pastor. The signing of the "legal" papers was an afterthought.

However, those papers mean everything to people who do not enjoy the rights (and responsibilities!) that come with those papers. I am flabbergasted that we live in a country that feels it's okay for prisoners to get married (the one I always talk about—although he passed away earlier this year—is Richard Ramirez, the "Night Stalker." We live in a country where it's okay for a man, who was evil personified, who *preyed on women*, to marry.) yet tax-paying, law-abiding, contributing members of society, who happen to be gay, are denied this same right.

I have quite a few gay friends, some are in relationships and some aren't. Same like my straight friends. The difference is that if my single straight friends found love today, the idea of that love being justified in the eyes of the law is there for them. But not my gay friends. That seems unfair to me.

Look, when I got married, my marriage was technically illegal in Alabama (albeit, the law was not enforced), because I am asian and my husband is white. That was in the late 90s. Unbelievable, right? I implore you to please vote on the right side of history. Please do protect the religious freedoms of the various faiths who do not want to accept same-sex marriage within their sanctuaries, that is important. However, please, please let our fellow human beings, who just happen to be gay, share their love and their responsibility as couples and families with dignity and respect.

I know that it's a political risk for you to vote "yes" on this issue.	I ask that you put that aside and do the right thing. Thank
you for your service to our community.

I am opposed to SB1, the redefining of marriage. I feel that it is important for you to know how I feel about this as part of your decision making process. It is my opinion that the issue of Same Sex Marriage should be voted on by the public just as it was back in 1998 when the majority of citizens in the State of Hawaii voted to approve a constitutional amendment against same sex marriages. The people did not understand the deceptive motive in the amendment that strips them of their power by giving the legislature absolute power over marriage.

As a Christian, I feel my beliefs will be infringed upon and one day my rights will be as well. Using history as my evidence, every empire that legalized same sex marriage resulted in an homosexual empire that persecuted Christians (pagan territories, Greeks and Romans). Emperor Maximus who worshipped a homosexual god Jupiter wanted the expulsion of all Christians. Antiochus brutally executed those who wouldn't worship their homosexual god. My name is Lianne Thompson and I would like to ask you to vote in favor of marriage rights for same-sex couples.

I am a Christian, have been since I chose to follow Jesus Christ and was subsequently baptized at age 16. I am now in my 40s. I was taught that Jesus wants us to love and respect one another. I was never taught to force my views on others who don't believe. Instead, I was told to love others and live by example.

It is because I am a Christian that I strongly believe in the separation of Church and State. I want to worship as I choose, and I am happy to let others follow their faith (or not) as they choose. Religious freedom works both ways. The government cannot impose a religion people, and the Church cannot impose its beliefs on the public (via government). I don't believe that there is any non-religious reason to deny same-sex couples the right to a legal marriage. Conversely, I will argue with anyone that churches have the right to deny same-sex couples the right to marry in their sanctuaries.

And, for the Catholic Church to say "t's okay to discriminate," is appalling to me. Do they forget a time in Hawai'i's not-so-distant history when their church was the subject of discrimination? Other Christian religions were acceptable, but not Catholics. Again, a separation of Church and State protects us all.

Allowing same-sex marriage should not, and I feel would not, lead to homosexuality being taught in the classroom. I didn't learn about any type of marriage in my public school experience. I did, however, learn about Creationism in the classroom.

The fact is, we do NOT value biblical marriage as a rule in this country and society. If we did, there would be no divorce. Divorced women would not be allowed to marry. Adultery would be illegal. If we truly considered the legal marriage that takes place a biblical entity, it would be so much more difficult to get married or divorced. We wouldn't have drive-through wedding chapels and game shows that make a marriage something to be "won." It's more difficult to get a driver's license than it is to get a marriage license. No, we do not value the sanctity of marriage in our legal marriage system. I for one, felt that I was "married" after I said my vows before my pastor. The signing of the "legal" papers was an afterthought.

However, those papers mean everything to people who do not enjoy the rights (and responsibilities!) that come with those papers. I am flabbergasted that we live in a country that feels it's okay for prisoners to get married (the one I always talk about—although he passed away earlier this year—is Richard Ramirez, the "Night Stalker." We live in a country where it's okay for a man, who was evil personified, who *preyed on women*, to marry.) yet tax-paying, law-abiding, contributing members of society, who happen to be gay, are denied this same right.

I have quite a few gay friends, some are in relationships and some aren't. Same like my straight friends. The difference is that if my single straight friends found love today, the idea of that love being justified in the eyes of the law is there for them. But not my gay friends. That seems unfair to me.

Look, when I got married, my marriage was technically illegal in Alabama (albeit, the law was not enforced), because I am asian and my husband is white. That was in the late 90s. Unbelievable, right? I implore you to please vote on the right side of history. Please do protect the religious freedoms of the various faiths who do not want to accept same-sex marriage within their sanctuaries, that is important. However, please, please let our fellow human beings, who just happen to be gay, share their love and their responsibility as couples and families with dignity and respect.

I know that it's a political risk for you to vote "yes" on this issue.	I ask that you put that aside and do the right thing. Than	nk
